CDTC ANNOUNCES PUBLIC INFORMATION MEETINGS FOR FINAL DRAFT NEW VISIONS 2040 LONG-RANGE REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN

The Capital District Transportation Committee (CDTC), which is responsible for federal transportation funding and programming in the 4-county region of Albany, Rensselaer, Saratoga, and Schenectady Counties, has announced the schedule for its public information meetings to introduce the recommendations in our Final Draft New Visions 2040 Plan, our new long-range, regional transportation plan.

CDTC is inviting the public to 2 informational meetings to provide feedback on more than 100 recommendations. The meetings will consist of a short presentation, followed by review and discussion of the key recommendations in the New Visions plan, and then interactive workstations where the public can ask specific questions and provide specific comments to CDTC staff.
