OFFICIAL ABSENTEE BALLOT FOR THE GENERAL ELECTION - NOVEMBER 7th, 2017

INSTRUCTIONS:

- (1) Mark only with a writing instrument provided by the board of elections.
- (2) To vote for a candidate whose name is printed on this ballot fill in the oval ○ above or next to the name of the candidate, like ●
- (3) To vote for a person whose name is not printed on this ballot write or stamp his or her name in the space labeled "Write-in" that appears under the candidates names for such office.
- (4) To vote yes or no on a proposal, if any, that appears on the reverse side, fill in the oval ○ that corresponds to your vote.
- (5) Any other mark or writing, or any erasure made on this ballot outside the voting oval or blank spaces provided for voting will void this entire ballot.
- (6) Do not overvote. If you select a greater number of candidates than there are vacancies to be filled, your ballot will be void for that public office, party position or proposal.
- (7) If you tear, or deface, or wrongly mark this ballot, call the Board of Elections at (518) 885-2249 for instructions on how to obtain a new ballot. Do not attempt to correct mistakes on the ballot by making erasures or cross outs. Erasures or cross outs may invalidate all or part of your ballot. Prior to submitting your ballot, if you make a mistake in completing the ballot or wish to change your ballot choices, you may obtain and complete a new ballot. You have a right to a replacement ballot upon return of the original ballot.

STATE OF NEW YORK, COUNTY OF SARATOGA

(8) To be counted, absentee ballots returned by mail must be postmarked no later than the day before election day and be received by the Saratoga County Board of Elections no later than 7 days after election day. **The ballot of a military voter must be postmarked not later than the day before election day and received by the Saratoga County Board of Elections not later than 13 days after election day to be cast and counted.**

HOW TO RETURN ABSENTEE BALLOT

1. After marking the ballot, fold such ballot and enclose it in the envelope bearing the voter's statement, and seal the envelope.
2. Fill in properly the blanks in the statement and sign your name.
3. Enclose the sealed envelope bearing the statement in the envelope addressed to the Saratoga County Board of Elections.

The proposed amendment also will allow bicycle trails and certain public utility lines to be located within the width of specified highways that cross the forest preserve while minimizing removal of trees and vegetation.
