

PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE MINUTES

NOVEMBER 13, 2006 – 4:00 P.M.

Present: Chairman Thompson; Supervisors Barrett, Hunter, Keyrouze, Lucia and Peck; Spencer Hellwig, Mgmt. Analyst; Joe Ritchey, DPW; Joe Miranda, Recycling Coordinator; Press.

Chairman Thompson called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

On a motion made by Mr. Lucia, seconded by Mr. Peck the minutes of the September 13, 2006 meeting were approved unanimously.

Mr. Ritchey gave a brief update on the 2006 Highway and Bridge Capital Reconstruction Plan as follows: Approximately 20 miles of reconstruction is done each year. The following towns have been included in this years plan: In the Town of Corinth a 2.9 mile section on Palmer Avenue; in the town of Wilton a section on Ballard Road near the Northway; in the town of Northumberland a ¼ mile section on River Road; in the City of Saratoga Springs a one mile section on Brooke Road; on County Road 64 there was approximately a 3.5 mile section that went from the City of Saratoga Springs to the Town of Malta; two sections on Cty Rt. 45, Galway Road; a two mile section in the town of Milton; a section of roadway in the town of Charlton; a ¾ mile section of Maltaville Road in the town of Malta; a 2.3 mile section in the Town of Halfmoon. All work has been completed he said.

Mr. Ritchey said there were three bridges on the schedule for the year. The largest is the Bryant's Bridge, which was a federally funded project. It is anticipated that this project will be completed by the end of December early January. In the town of Northumberland, Strong Road over the Snookkill, has been completed; and culvert work in the town of Day.

Mr. Miranda distributed his recycling report for November. He said revenues for the year are 27% ahead of 2005. Tonnage has decreased 5% and the markets are still going strong. It is hopeful that the program will top \$700,000 in revenue for the year. Year to date revenue is at \$586,256 compared to last years \$550,000 for the year.

On a motion made by Mr. Lucia, seconded by Mr. Hunter the meeting was adjourned.
