On a motion by Mr. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Rowland the minutes of the November 14, 2012 meeting were unanimously approved.

Mr. Hellwig reviewed the following:

PERSONNEL & INSURANCE

Mr. Hellwig said there will be three resolutions. The first one is proposed changes to the Civil Service Exam fees to offset the costs for the examination booklets and the processing of the application. The second item will be an extension of the agreement with Benetech on a month to month basis through the period it takes to transition to Empire Blue Cross. The final item under Personnel will be an amendment to the standard workday resolution to reflect the appointment of Tina Potter to the Commissioner of Social Services.

* Authorizing an increase to the charge for Civil Service Exams to cover the costs associated with providing these exams for both residents and non-residents of Saratoga County.

* Authorizing a renewal of the agreement with Benetech, Inc. to provide health insurance consulting services on a month to month basis at a cost not to exceed \$6,037.50 per month.

* Amending Resolution 181-12 to approve a revised standard workday resolution for elected and appointed county officials for retirement purposes.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

There will be one resolution to follow the recommendation of Agricultural & Farmland Protection Board and the County Planning Board not to change the condition & terms of District #1.

* Approving the continuation of the Consolidated Agricultural District #1 as recommended by the County Agricultural & Farmland Protection Board and the County Planning Board.

BUILDINGS & GROUNDS

The first item is to award Stilsing Electric a contract to perform the necessary mechanical and electric work needed to decommission Maplewood's co-generation plant. The second item is a renewal agreement with Stewart's Ice Cream for Supreme Court Chambers. The final item will be an amendment to resolution 207-12 which authorized an agreement with Saratoga Prime Properties and will allow for the inclusion of exterior costs.

* Authorizing the Chairman to enter into an agreement with Stilsing Electric to perform the decommissioning of the Maplewood manor co-generation plant at a cost of \$105,865 ad amending the budget in relation thereto.

* Authorizing the Chairman to enter into a lease renewal agreement with Stewart's Ice Cream Co., Inc. for chambers for Supreme Court Justice, Stephen Ferradino.

* Amending Resolution 207-12 to modify the lease agreement with Saratoga Prime Properties, LLC for Mental Health office space to incorporate a fixed cost for exterior improvement required by the City of Saratoga Springs.

RACING

There will be one item supporting the Saratoga Casino & Raceway as a location for one of the seven that is expected to be authorized by the State Legislature.

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* Expressing the Board's strong support for Saratoga Casino & Raceway as a location for one of the seven potential casinos to be authorized by the State Legislature pending the amendment of Article 1, Section 9 of the New York State Constitution.

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PUBLIC HEALTH

The first item is for a renewal agreement to provide physical therapy services at Maplewood. The second is for a lease agreement with Home of the Good Shepherd to recover the costs associated with caring for the residents that were displaced as a result of a fire at their facility. The third item is renewal contract with the community mental health providers that are part of the work done by our Mental Health Department. The final item is authorization to pay for the services under Phase 3 of the contract with Harris Beach to handle the transfer of the nursing home. Mr. Hellwig wanted to re-state the disclosure that he made at the Law & Finance meeting that his relationship with Karl Sleight who is an employee at Harris Beach is no longer in place as his sister-in-law is no longer married to him.

* Authorizing the Chairman to enter into a renewal agreement with Thomas Nicolla Consulting Services PLLC to provide physical therapy services at an hourly rate of \$46.48.

* Authorizing the Chairman to enter into a lease agreement with the Home of the Good Shepherd to provide temporary housing for residents displaced by fire at a cost of \$44.13 per day per resident.

* Authorizing the Chairman to enter into a one year renewal agreement with agencies providing various counseling, substance abuse, vocational, housing and case management services.

* Authorizing payment to Harris Beach, PLLC for professional services provided under Phase 3 of their consulting contract at a cost not to exceed \$35,000.

PUBLIC SAFETY

The first item is for the renewal agreements between the Sheriff's Department and the Towns of Clifton Park & Halfmoon for additional sheriff services. The second item will be authorization to accept an Ignition Interlock grant that will provide reimbursement to the Probation Department for the expenses they incur for their participation in that program. The third item is to accept additional funding from the Governor's Traffic Safety Committee for STOP-DWI patrols.

* Authorizing the Chairman to enter into successor agreement to provide additional law enforcement services in 2013 with the Town of Halfmoon and the Town of Clifton Park.

* Authorizing the Chairman to enter into an agreement with the NYS Division of Criminal Justice Service to accept \$44,745 in State aid for reimbursement of expenses related to the implementation of the Ignition Interlock Program.

* Authorizing the acceptance of \$22,680 of additional State funding to supplement STOP-DWI enforcement activities.

SOCIAL PROGRAMS

There will be one item from the Social Programs Committee which is to provide funding to the Moreau Community Center to transport senior citizens to local programs

* Authorizing the Chairman to enter into an agreement with the Moreau Community Center to provide \$12,000 in funding for a senior transportation bus.

PUBLIC WORKS

There will be two items with the first being a retainer agreement with Mark Schachner to serve as special counsel for legal services with regards to the privatization of the landfill and will amend the contract with Gerhardt LLC who is the consult to cover services needed for the RFP process. The second item is for a supplemental agreement with DOT to access additional funding for a right-of-way purchase.

* Authorizing the Chairman to enter into an agreement with Mark Schachner to provide legal services related to the privatization of the County landfill and an amendment to the consulting contract with Gerhardt, LLC for additional consulting services not to exceed \$8,000.

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* Authorizing the Chairman to execute a supplemental agreement with NYSDOT to access additional funding for the purchase of right-of-way necessary for the replacement of US 4 over the Anthony Kill Bridge in the City of Mechanicville.

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LAW AND FINANCE

The first item is a modification of a resolution to expedite payment for health insurance claims that are submitted by our health insurance provider. As a result of the quick turn around that is needed, this resolution was adopted earlier in the year but needs to be amended because of the change in carriers. The second item is approval of the 2013 scale of charges for the Sewer District which were unanimously approved at the Commission's meeting and were presented at a public hearing in November. The third item is required in order to issue tax bills. The fourth item is approval to accept funding in the County Clerk's office. The last item is establishing the organizational meeting for 2013.

* Authorizing the County Treasurer to make express payments to the county's medical, prescription drug and dental health insurance carriers in advance of an audit by the County Auditor and the Personnel Department, contingent upon a pre-audit review by the County's health insurance consultant.

- * Confirming the 2013 scale of charges for the Saratoga County Sewer District.
- * Levying amounts payable to County Treasurer and Town Supervisors.

* Authorizing the Chairman to enter into an agreement with New York State to accept a Local Government Records Management Improvement Fund Grant and authorizing the filling of seven (7) positions of Clerk part-time and amending the 2013 adopted budget.

* Establishing January 2, 2013 at 2:00 p.m. as the date and time for the organizational meeting of the Board of Supervisors.

The invocation was given by Patti Southworth, Chaplain.

PRSENTATIONS:

Kathy Marchione, County Clerk: She said she had a couple of items she wanted to report to the Board. The first is that the County Clerk's office has been preparing for e-recording which means that people will be able to, right from their offices, record documents once they have purchased supporting software. They have been working with two different vendors which the customer will pay a fee to. This allows the customer to create the index to file the document which will save the customer a great deal of money and time for the County Clerk's staff. When documents are filed this way, the return filing is sent via e-mail to the customer and will save the County in postage. Mrs. Marchione said that within 5 years 60% of the documents will be coming in paperless which is great for the environment and the filers will get their documents back the same day. She said this has come a long way since she started. Documents use to take up to 9 weeks to get back to the customer whereas not they will be looking at same day.

Mrs. Marchione said another project her office has been working on for almost two years is the census and naturalization records. Census records she is referring to are records from 1850 - 1925 as well as State census records dated 1845, 1865, 1875. In addition there are naturalization records from 1906 to 1928 will now be available on line now. So the 3,000 on line customers that search the records will now also be available to enjoy these records. She is very proud to announce that they are online.

Mrs. Marchione then unveiled a 100 year old license plate that has been provided to the County Clerk's Office and will be on display in the office.

Mrs. Marchione then thanked the Board for their support over the years as this would be her last Board Meeting as County Clerk because of her election to the State Senate. Chairman Wood thanked Mrs. Marchione for her dedication and thanked her for keeping her office on the cutting edge. Mrs. Wormuth thanked Mrs. Marchione for her 15 years as a dedicated County Clerk and gave some history on Mrs. Marchione's accomplishments at the County and the Town of Halfmoon.

RESCINDING RESOLUTION 102-00 AND IMPLEMENTING A CHARGE FOR CIVIL SERVICE EXAMS TO COVER THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH ADMINISTERING THE EXAMS

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 102-00, Saratoga County affirmed its policy of absorbing the fees charged by the State of New York to applicants wishing to take Civil Service Exams, in order to encourage qualified persons to seek employment with the County; and

WHEREAS, as a result of continued fee increases imposed by the State for the taking of Civil Service Exams, and the failure of numerous applicants to appear for exams paid for by the County, the County is no longer able to absorb the Civil Service Exam fees charged by the State; and

WHEREAS, our Personnel and Insurance Committee and the County Director of Personnel have recommended that the County implement a charge to Civil Service Exam applicants of \$10.00 per exam for nonuniformed positions and \$20.00 per exam for uniformed positions in order to cover the costs to the County associated with administering such exams; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, with regret, Resolution 102-00 is hereby rescinded effective immediately; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the County of Saratoga hereby establishes and imposes a charge to applicants wishing to take Civil Service Exams of \$10.00 per exam for a non-uniformed position and \$20.00 per exam for uniformed positions, with said charges being applicable to both residents and non-residents of Saratoga County.

APPROVING THE PROPOSED CONTINUATION OF SARATOGA COUNTY CONSOLIDATED AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT #1

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 176-96, the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors approved the continuation of Saratoga County Agricultural District #1, and its consolidation with Saratoga County Agricultural Districts #3 and #4 to form Saratoga County Consolidated Agricultural District #1; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 53-06, this Board last approved the continuation of Saratoga County Consolidated Agricultural District No. 1 with certain amendments to the District's boundaries; and

WHEREAS, Article 25-AA of the Agriculture and Markets Law requires an extensive review process for the determination of whether to continue an agricultural district; and

WHEREAS, in compliance with Agriculture and Markets Law §303-a, notice of the review of Saratoga County Consolidated Agricultural District #1, and a solicitation of modifications and public comment, for the 30 day period from May 1, 2012 through May 31, 2012 was published; and

WHEREAS, during the 30 day period of public review, no comments or proposals for modification were received by the Clerk of the Board; and

WHEREAS, the proposal to continue the District was referred to the Saratoga County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board for review and preparation of a report on the proposed continuation of the District as required by Agriculture and Markets Law §303-a; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing required by Agriculture and Markets Law §303-a on the proposed continuation of the District was duly held on September 13, 2012 in the Town of Saratoga, at which time all those desiring to be heard were heard; and

WHEREAS, the affirmative report of the Saratoga County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board recommending the continuation of the District has been duly filed with the members and Clerk of this Board; and

WHEREAS, said report and the public comment received make clear that the continuation of the District would not have a significant adverse environmental impact, and, therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement is not required; now, therefore, be it

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RESOLVED, that this Board of Supervisors finds that this proposed action of continuation of Saratoga County Consolidated Agricultural District #1 will not result in any significant adverse environmental impacts, and the preparation of an environmental impact statement is not required; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board is authorized to execute and file a negative declaration for the continuation of Consolidated Agricultural District #1; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that this Board of Supervisors adopts and approves the proposed continuation of Saratoga County Consolidated Agricultural District #1 without modifications or amendments to the District's boundaries; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of this Board forward copies of this Resolution of Adoption, the said proposal for continuation of Consolidated Agricultural District #1, the report of the Saratoga County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board to the New York State Commissioner of Agriculture and Markets, and all other records required by Agriculture and Markets Law §303-a (3) as part of a district review plan.

AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR OF THE BOARD TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH STILSING ELECTRIC, INC. TO PERFORM THE DECOMMISSIONING OF THE MAPLEWOOD MANOR CO-GENERATIONAL PLANT

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 165-12, this Board authorized and directed the decommissioning of the co-generation facility serving the Maplewood Manor Nursing Home, and approved and directed the reconnection of Maplewood Manor to National Grid for the provision of electric services; and

WHEREAS, the County Department of Public Works has solicited and entertained competitive bids for the provision of electrical services needed to decommission the Maplewood Manor co-generation facility and reconnect Maplewood Manor to National Grid's electrical grid; and

WHEREAS, our Buildings and Grounds Committee and the Commissioner of the County Department of Public Works have recommended that a contract for such electrical services be awarded to Stilsing Electric, Inc., the lowest bidder on the contract; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board is authorized to execute an agreement with Stilsing Electric, Inc. of Rensselaer, New York, for the provision of electrical services necessary to decommission the Maplewood Manor co-generation facility and reconnect Maplewood Manor to National Grid's electrical grid, at a cost not to exceed \$105,865, the form and content of said contract being subject to the approval of the County Attorney.

AUTHORIZING RENEWAL OF LEASE WITH STEWART'S SHOPS CORP. FOR SUPREME COURT CHAMBERS

WHEREAS, a shortage of appropriate office space in the municipal center requires the lease of space for chambers for Supreme Court Justice Stephen Ferradino; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 208-07, this Board authorized the lease of office space for Judge Ferradino from Stewart's Shops Corp. (Stewart's) on Route 9 in the Town of Malta for a term of five years; and

power, trash removal, snow removal, office cleaning and maintenance, which costs shall not exceed \$10.88 per square foot; and

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WHEREAS, the lease proposed by Stewart's includes an option to renew for two (2) additional one (1) year terms, with the base rent being subject to an annual increase each January equal to the increase in the Consumer Price Index for the preceding year; and

WHEREAS, our Buildings and Grounds Committee recommends acceptance of this offer; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of this Board of Supervisors is authorized to execute a renewal lease agreement with Stewart's Shops Corp. for the lease of approximately 2110 square feet of space in its building in the Town of Malta for a term of eleven months commencing February 1, 2013 and terminating December 31, 2013, at a base rent of \$12.00 per square foot plus operating costs up to but not exceeding \$10.88 per square foot; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that said lease agreement shall be subject to renewal for two (2) additional one (1) year terms, with the base rent for each term being subject to an annual increase each January equal to the increase in the Consumer Price Index for the preceding year; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the lease shall also provide that, subject to prior notice of at least sixty days, it may be terminated by the County; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the form and content of such renewal agreement shall be subject to the approval of the County Attorney.

AMENDING RESOLUTION 207-12 TO REVISE THE BASE RENTAL AMOUNT IN YEARS 4 THROUGH 10 OF THE AUTHORIZED LEASE AGREEMENT WITH SARATOGA PRIME PROPERTIES FOR THE SARATOGA COUNTY MENTAL HEALTH CENTER

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 207-12, this Board authorized a lease with Saratoga Prime Properties, LLC for the premises known as 135 South Broadway, in the City of Saratoga Springs, for occupancy by the Saratoga County Mental Health Center for a term of five years to commence on the date of occupancy; at a base monthly rent of \$28,152, subject to a 3% increase in years seven and nine of any renewal period of the lease; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 257 - 12, this Board adopted a Local Law No. 3 of 2012 authorizing the leasing of the premises located at 135 South Broadway in the City of Saratoga Springs from Saratoga Prime Properties, LLC for a term of ten years, instead of the five year term authorized by County Law §215 and Resolution 207-12, in order to provide Saratoga Prime Properties, LLC with the financial assurances needed to recoup its renovation costs for the premises over the longer ten year term; and

WHEREAS, due to a mistake in the interpretation of Saratoga Prime Properties LLC's original lease proposal as it pertained to the amount of the fit up costs the County would be paying to Saratoga Prime Properties, LLC as part of its rental costs, it is necessary to amend Resolution 207-12 to revise the base monthly rent for the property to include fixed exterior renovation costs, as well as interior renovation costs for the property; and

WHEREAS, our Buildings and Grounds Committee has recommended that the base monthly rent of \$28,152 set forth in Resolution 207-12 be revised to increase said rent by 3% in years four, six, eight and ten of the lease; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that Resolution 207-12 be and is hereby amended to increase the base monthly rent of \$28,152 payable by the County to Saratoga to Prime Properties, LLC for the lease of the premises at 135 South Broadway, Saratoga Springs, by 3% in years four, six, eight and ten of the lease, thereby making the base monthly rent \$28,996 in lease years four and five; \$29,866 in lease years six and seven; \$30,762 in lease years eight and nine; and \$31,685 in lease year ten.

WHEREAS, the scheduled public hearing was held and all persons appearing or desiring to be heard have been heard by this Board; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this Board of Supervisors, on this 18th day of December, 2012 hereby adopts a Local Law identified as Introductory No. 3, Print No. 1 of 2012, as set forth in the annexed Schedule A.

COUNTY OF SARATOGA - LOCAL LAW NO. 3 OF 2012

A LOCAL LAW AUTHORIZING THE LEASING OF REAL PROPERTY OF SARATOGA PRIME PROPERTIES, LLC LOCATED AT 135 SOUTH BROADWAY, IN THE CITY OF SARATOGA SPRINGS, FOR A TERM OF TEN YEARS

BE IT ENACTED by the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors as follows:

<u>SECTION 1:</u> The County of Saratoga leases space from Saratoga Care, Inc. for the use and operation of the County's Mental Health Center. Saratoga Care, Inc. has exercised its option to terminate the County's lease effective May 31, 2013. After soliciting and entertaining competitive proposals for the lease of new space for the County Mental Health Center, the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors accepted the proposal of Saratoga Prime Properties, LLC for the lease of the premises known as 135 Broadway, Saratoga Springs, New York, being a portion of the City of Saratoga Springs Inside District Tax Map, Section 178.27, Block 1, Parcel 42. Said premises were formerly the site of an automobile dealership, and the building on the property requires extensive interior and exterior renovations to make it suitable for use as office space and treatment facilities for the County Mental Health Center. The proposal of Saratoga Prime Properties, LLC that was accepted by the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors includes as part of the monthly rent for the premises a pro-rated portion of the renovation costs of the building over a period of ten years. Due to said extensive renovation costs, it is not financially feasible for Saratoga Prime Properties, LLC to enter into a lease for its premises for a term of less than ten years.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Notwithstanding the provisions of Section two hundred fifteen of the County Law, or any other law of the State of New York, or of Resolution 207-12 of the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors, authorization is hereby given to the Chairman of the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors to execute a lease of the real property owned by Saratoga Prime Properties, LLC located at 135 South Broadway in the City of Saratoga Springs, and identified on the City of Saratoga Springs Inside Tax District Tax Map as being a portion of Section 178.27, Block 1, Parcel 42, for a term of ten years, with an option to renew for two additional five year terms, for the County of Saratoga's municipal purpose of operating its Saratoga County Mental Health Center and providing mental health services to individuals in need. Such lease shall be subject to the approval of the County Attorney. Rental payments for said premises shall be in accordance with Resolution 207-12 of the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors, or any amendment(s) thereof.

SECTION 3. This Local Law shall take effect after it is filed as provided in Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

RESOLUTION 258 - 12

EXPRESSING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' STRONG SUPPORT FOR SARATOGA CASINO AND RACEWAY AS A LOCATION FOR ONE OF THE SEVEN POTENTIAL CASINOS TO BE AUTHORIZED BY THE STATE LESIGLATURE PENDING THE AMENDMENT OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION

WHEREAS, Governor Andrew M. Cuomo has introduced, and the New York State Legislature has passed, a concurrent resolution introducing an amendment to Article 1, Section 9 of the State Constitution to allow no more than seven casinos as authorized and prescribed by the State Legislature; and

WHEREAS, amending the State Constitution requires that such concurrent resolution must pass two consecutive sessions of the State Legislature and be approved by public referendum; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 21-02, the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors adopted a Local Law (Introductory No. 1, Print No. 2) on February 13, 2002, authorizing Saratoga Casino and Raceway (formerly "Saratoga Equine Sports Center") to operate video lottery gaming in accordance with the New York State Tax Law and subject to state licensure and regulation; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the New York State Tax Law, revenues generated from the Video Lottery Terminals (VLTs) authorized to operate at Saratoga Casino and Raceway have been and are distributed in part to New York State for the purpose of funding education, to the Saratoga Raceway for the purpose of enhancing purses, and to the breeding funds that support local breeders and owners; and

WHEREAS, Saratoga Casino and Raceway is a proven revenue producer for New York State whose VLT operations have generated more than a half billion dollars in education aid since 2004, and over a hundred million dollars more in support of state lottery administration; and

WHEREAS, the approximately \$100 million generated to date by VLT operations at Saratoga Casino and Raceway for enhanced purses and breeding support has kept the harness racing industry alive in Saratoga County, directly supporting local racing-related jobs; and

WHEREAS, Saratoga Casino and Raceway is a major employer in Saratoga County, having approximately 400 full-time and 225 part-time employees; and

WHEREAS, in the event that the proposed Constitutional Amendment is approved and the State Legislature authorizes expanded casino gaming establishments in locations that do not include Saratoga Casino and Raceway, that action would risk negatively impacting the facility, thereby reducing the revenues generated from its VLTs, and in turn reducing the corresponding reinvestment of those revenues in education and the local racing industry, and endangering local jobs; and

WHEREAS, not including Saratoga Casino and Raceway as an approved casino site would also result in a lost opportunity for local economic growth in terms of: increased tourism; the direct, indirect and induced effects of new jobs created to support expanded casino operations; and the construction jobs generated from building new gaming space; and

WHEREAS, Saratoga Casino and Raceway is a "shovel-ready" location for expanded casino gaming with existing infrastructure in place to support such a facility; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors expresses its strong support for Saratoga Casino and Raceway as a location for one of the seven potential casinos to be authorized by the State Legislature pending the amendment of Article 1, Section 9 of the New York State Constitution; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors urges the State Legislature to retain the provisions and formulas in New York State Tax Law requiring the reinvestment of VLT-generated revenues into education and the local racing industry; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors urges the State Legislature to develop appropriate provisions for the mandatory reinvestment of revenue generated from expanded casino operations into education, enhanced purses at local tracks, support for local breeders, and assistance to host communities for the purpose of defraying local costs associated with expanded casino operations or minimizing or reducing real property taxes; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors urges the Governor and State Legislature to recognize the unique importance of the racing industry to Saratoga County's local economy by allowing our

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elected county representatives to actively participate in deliberations on the specifics of the proposed casino gaming expansion; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors forward a certified copy of this Resolution to Governor Andrew M. Cuomo and the county's representatives in the New York State Senate and Assembly.

WHEREAS, on December 2, 2012, the Home of the Good Shepard sustained significant damage due to a fire, and was forced to evacuate and temporarily relocate over 30 residents to Maplewood Manor; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Maplewood Manor has calculated the cost of housing residents from the Home of the Good Shepard at \$41.32 per day plus the mandated 6.8% cash assessment for a total of \$44.13 per day per resident; and

WHEREAS, our Public Health Committee and the Director of Maplewood Manor have recommended that the County enter into a lease with the Home of the Good Shepard to temporarily house residents of the Home of the Good Shepard at Maplewood Manor at a cost of \$44.13 per day per resident; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board is hereby authorized to execute a lease agreement with the Home of the Good Shepard at Highpointe, in the Town of Malta, to temporarily shelter residents displaced by a fire at the Home of the Good Shepard at the Maplewood Manor Nursing Home at a cost of \$44.13 per day per resident; with the form and content of such lease agreement being subject to the approval of the County Attorney.

AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENTS RELATED TO THE PRIVATIZATION OF THE COUNTY LANDFILL FACILITY

WHEREAS, Saratoga County developed a landfill facility in 2001 to serve the residents, businesses, industries, and institutions of the County and to protect public health and the environment, enhance the quality of life, and promote economic development; and

WHEREAS, upon completion of the landfill facility the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors decided not to open the facility and instead to hold it for future use, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 30-12, this Board initiated a request for proposals [RFP] process to identify potential interest by private companies in the landfill facility pursuant to the procedures established in Section 120-w of General Municipal Law, and authorized the retention of the professional consulting services of Gerhardt, LLC to prepare such RFP, evaluate all proposals received in response to the RFP, and make a recommendation of a contract award, at a cost not to exceed \$24,425, and

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WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 158-12, this Board directed the issuance of a final Request for Proposals for the potential privatization of the County Landfill facility pursuant to the procedures established in General Municipal Law §120-w including all requirements for public notice; and

WHEREAS, the public notice and public comment requirements pursuant to GML §120-w were completed and three final proposals were received on October 9, 2012, and

WHEREAS, the Landfill Privatization Sub-committee of this Board of Supervisors has met with the three companies regarding their proposals, and said Sub-committee recommends that the services of special counsel be retained to 1) represent the County in meetings with the attorneys representing one or more RFP respondents, 2) prepare all notices required by the applicable law and regulations, 3) prepare all documents, findings and other filings that are necessary for compliance with all applicable laws and regulations, and 4) prepare the agreements necessary for completion of the privatization of the County Landfill Facility; and

WHEREAS, the Subcommittee has further recommended that the contract with Gerhardt LLC for the management of the RFP process be extended in order to complete negotiations with the RFP respondents and work with the County's designated special counsel, and

WHEREAS, the Sub-committee has reviewed proposals from three law firms to provide special counsel services for the legal work on the landfill privatization process, and the Sub-committee recommends that the proposal of Attorney Mark Schachner, the lowest proposal received, be accepted; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board is hereby authorized to execute a retainer agreement with Mark Schachner of Miller, Mannix, Schachner & Hafner LLC of Glens Falls, to serve as Special Counsel with respect to the privatization of the County Landfill at a rate of \$190 per hour, and at a total cost not to exceed \$9,500; and, be it further

RESOLVED, the Chair of the Board is hereby authorized to execute an amendment to the contract with consultant Gerhardt LLC of New Hartford, New York, providing for additional consulting services at a rate of \$125 per hour, and at a cost not to exceed \$8,000, in order to complete the management of the RFP process; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the form and content of the foregoing agreements shall be subject to the approval of the County Attorney.

BUDGET IMPACT STATEMENT: No budget impact.

AUTHORIZING THE IMPLEMENTATION, AND FUNDING IN THE FIRST INSTANCE 100% OF THE FEDERAL-AID AND STATE "MARCHISELLI" PROGRAM-AID ELIGIBLE COSTS, OF A TRANSPORTATION FEDERAL-AID PROJECT, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFORE

WHEREAS, a Project BIN 2202960, Rt4 (Central Avenue) over the Anthony Kill, in the City of Mechanicville, P.I.N. 1757.10 (the Project") is eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S. Code, as amended, that calls for the apportionment of the costs such program to be borne at the ratio of 80% Federal funds and 20% non-federal funds; and

WHEREAS, the County of Saratoga desires to advance the Project by making a commitment of 100% of the non-federal share of the costs of Design work and additional Right of Way acquisition;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors duly convened does hereby

RESOLVE, that the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors hereby approves the above-subject project; and it is hereby further

RESOLVED, that the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes to pay in the first instance 100% of the federal and non-federal share of the cost of Design work and additional Right of Way acquisition for the Project or portions thereof; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the sum of \$228,237 (Two Hundred Twenty Eight Thousand Two Hundred Thirty-Seven Dollars and no cents) has already been appropriated and made available to cover the cost of participation in the above phase of the Project; and it is further

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RESOLVED, that the additional sum of \$43,340 (Forty Three Thousand Three Hundred Forty Dollars and no cents) is hereby appropriated from the County's Highway Fund and made available to cover the cost of participation in the above phase of the Project; and it is further

RESOLVED, that in the event the full federal and non-federal share costs of the project exceeds the amount appropriated above, the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors shall convene as soon as possible to appropriate said excess amount immediately upon the notification by the New York State Department of Transportation thereof, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors be and is hereby authorized to execute all necessary Agreements, certifications or reimbursement requests for Federal Aid and/or Marchiselli Aid on behalf of the County of Saratoga_with the New York State Department of Transportation in connection with the advancement or approval of the Project and providing for the administration of the Project and the municipality's first instance funding of project costs and permanent funding of the local share of federal-aid and state-aid eligible Project costs and all Project costs within appropriations therefore that are not so eligible, and it is further

RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be filed with the New York State Commissioner of Transportation by attaching it to any necessary Agreement in connection with the Project and it is further

RESOLVED, this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

<u>BUDGET IMPACT STATEMENT</u>: The county share of this \$43,340 purchase is \$2,167 and is available in the 2012 budget.

WHEREAS, pursuant to County Law §266, the Commissioners of Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1 adopted a scale of charges for its 2013 services; and

WHEREAS, this scale was duly published in the official newspapers of the County and on the County of Saratoga's official website and was duly filed with our Clerk of the Board; and

WHEREAS, after due consideration, and upon the District's recommendation, this Board finds that it is in the public interest to adopt that scale of charges for collection, conveyance, treatment and disposal of sewage; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the following 2013 scale of charges for the Sewer District, be, and the same hereby is, confirmed, namely:

PROPOSED 2013 SCALE OF CHARGES FOR SARATOGA COUNTY SEWER DISTRICT NO. 1

SECTION 1 - SEWER CHARGES IMPOSED

Pursuant to County Law §266(1)(a), Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1 hereby imposes sewer charges for 2013 upon all premises and real property, within or without District boundaries, connected to, the District's sewer system.

SECTION 2 - ESTABLISHMENT AND CONFIRMATION OF SEWER CHARGES

Subject to confirmation by the County Board of Supervisors, this scale of charges may, from time to time, be amended by the District's Commission.

SECTION 3 - CRITERIA FOR ESTABLISHING SEWER USER CHARGES

The scale of sewer user charges shall use the following criteria:

(a) A user is defined as any piece of land upon which a building or buildings stand and is connected to an interceptor, trunk or collector sewer served by the District.

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(b) The annual cost of debt service, administration, operation and maintenance for the District's treatment facilities will be generally allocated to all users.

(c) The annual cost of debt service and operation and maintenance associated with the interceptor sewer, will be generally allocated to all users connected to and/or discharging into the system.

(d) The annual cost of debt service and operation and maintenance associated with each major trunk sewer system will be generally allocated to all users connected to and/or discharging into the system.

(e) A connection unit is defined as a single-family dwelling unit. Units include, but are not limited to, a single family house, each apartment unit (e.g. an apartment building with six apartments is six units), each half of a duplex, a cottage, a camp, a mobile home, and each unit of a condominium or townhouse. A "unit" as used for billing purposes will be 200 gallons per day of sewer discharge, or any portion thereof. No user will be rated at less than one unit. Users will be rated in terms of whole connection units. Each tenant with sanitary facilities within a commercial complex will be defined as an individual user.

(f) For all users, including single-family dwelling units, equivalent connection units (E.C.U.) will be determined based on the following schedule which accommodates peak demand and potential flow needs:

USER & COLLECTOR CHARGES:

Single parcel:

A. Vacant - no charge unless a lateral was requested and installed. If lateral is installed, a collector fee shall be charged for each lateral.

B. Occupied - Residential

- (1) Single Family Residence
 - a. 1 user, 1 collector as applicable.

(2) Multiple Family Residence – Each separate dwelling unit in a two

family, three family or multiple dwelling, which is not an apartment

- a. 1 user per dwelling unit
- b. 1 collector per dwelling unit as applicable
 - (3) Apartments

a. Each dwelling unit is assigned 1 user and 1 collector as applicable

b. Subsidized senior housing - For complexes receiving Federal, State or municipal rent subsidies for dedicated senior housing, each 2 dwelling units will be assigned 1 user and 1 collector as applicable

c. Proof of entitlement to the designation as senior subsidized housing will need to be provided by the user and will be subject to approval of the Sewer Commission; confirmation of continuance of the subsidy will need to be provided to the Sewer District by September 1st of each year.

- (4) Trailer Parks
 - a. 1 user for each approved trailer site
- (5) Condominiums
 - a. Each unit is assigned 1 user and 1 collector as applicable
 - b. Charges will commence upon issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy by the local municipality for those units that the New York State Department of Law has authorized to be offered for sale. Common area facilities will be assessed to the owner of record as determined under provisions of Commercial Users.
- C. Occupied Commercial
 - (1) 1 Collector for each user

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For all commercial users: where actual sewer flow is measured, that flow (one year's record data) shall be used for determining an E.C.U. count with adjustments for discharge strength and content. The data is to provide cumulative and daily peak flow volumes; the methodology is subject to approval of the Executive Director.

For each additional 75,000 gallons or any part thereof, the number of connection units shall be increased by one.

(g) When there is a substantial increase in sewer flows during the current year, the District may adjust the number of connection units charged and bill the user directly for that additional sum pursuant to Section 8.

(h) Saratoga Spa State Park and Mount McGregor will be charged based on their 2012 measured waste expressed in E.C.U.'s discharged to District facilities.

(i) Wastewater from wet processing and other operations is subject to the restrictions, prohibitions and surcharges outlined in the District's rules and regulations covering the discharge of sewage, industrial waste and other waste into the Saratoga County sewer system and all sewers tributary thereto.

(i) A user discharging B.O.D. or T.S.S. to the District facilities exceeding the amount allowed in the District's rules and regulations will be charged \$700 per dry ton for that excess per conditions of their discharge permit.

(k) All costs of the District's pretreatment and spill response program including, but not limited to, laboratory testing, labor, equipment, materials, consultants and sub-consultants, contractors and subcontractors, and fines, shall be reimbursed by the individual or user.

(1) Outside non-residential users will be charged two and one-half times the rate established for the trunk system servicing that user, residential housing will be one and one-half times that rate.

(m) Collector sewer rates are generally based on the overall construction costs of the collector system together with debt service and operation and maintenance costs of the collector system.

(n) Users of collection sewers turned over to the District will be charged for that portion of the District facilities utilized and at the same rate as the other users of the particular system.

SECTION 4 - SCALE OF CHARGES

The following is the 2013 scale of charges for the trunking and treatment of sewage.

(a) The cost of the treatment facilities and interceptor sewer lines is allocated among the 23 trunk systems. The units for those trunks and the portion of the 2013 user charges based on those units are as follows:

SECTION 6 - PAYMENT OF SEWER USER CHARGES

All sewer charges, excepting those for Saratoga Springs, Saratoga Spa State Park, Mount McGregor, Town of Schaghticoke, Saratoga County Water Authority, NYSERDA and GLOBALFOUNDRIES shall be collected pursuant to Real Property Tax Law Article 11. The assessor of each municipality utilizing the town and county tax bills for the collection of taxes shall properly code the assessment roll as to the number of connection units for each particular property and for those properties utilizing the collector system. The assessor shall use the District's formula to determine the units for multiple dwellings and commercial users of the trunk and collector systems.

The City of Saratoga Springs, which includes the Geyser Crest, Geyser Road and a portion of the Saratoga Lake trunk sewer systems; as well as the Kirby Road, Loughberry Lake, Crescent Avenue and a portion of the Saratoga Lake collector systems shall each be considered as a single-bulk user and shall be so billed by the District. The city's collecting officer shall determine the appropriate method of assessing and collecting its sewer user charge. This single-bulk user charge may be passed on to city residents as a city sewer rent and enforced pursuant to General Municipal Law §452.

City payments shall be due quarterly by March 31, June 30, September 30 and December 31, 2013. A late payment charge of one percent (1%) per month shall be added for each month or portion thereof until paid.

The District shall bill Saratoga Spa State Park their 2013 user charges payable no later than May 1, 2013.

Mount McGregor shall be billed directly by the District and payment shall be on a quarterly basis.

The Town of Schaghticoke shall be billed by the District for service to the Hemstreet Park area of the Town on a semi-annual basis in accordance with the terms of the District's Inter-municipal Agreement with the Town.

GLOBALFOUNDRIES and Saratoga County Water Authority will be billed on a monthly basis based on flows discharged the preceding month per terms of their Industrial Discharge Permits.

Payments by single-bulk users shall be made to the County Treasurer who shall reject any untimely or insufficient payment. The postmark date of a payment shall be evidence of payment.

SECTION 7 - PENALTIES FOR LATE PAYMENTS

Sewer charges shall be subject to the same penalties and interest applicable to County taxes generally.

SECTION 8 - PAYMENT OF SEWER CHARGES NOT ON TOWN/COUNTY TAX ROLLS

The District shall bill directly those users of the collector sewer system and the trunk sewer system not appearing on the town and county tax rolls. Payments shall be made to the District and forwarded to the County Treasurer. Partial payments will not be accepted and will be returned.

The District shall also bill directly those users that have had an increase in connection units during the year.

The County Treasurer shall prepare and transmit to the Board of Supervisors, on or before December 1, a list of District residents or property owners within the District who are in arrears in the payment of such trunk or

collector charges for a period of 30 days or more. The list shall contain a brief description of the properties for which the services were provided, the names of the persons or corporations liable to pay for same and the amount chargeable to each including penalties and interest computed to December 31.

The Board of Supervisors shall levy such sums against the properties liable and shall state the amount thereof in a separate column in the annual tax rolls of the various municipalities under the name of "county sewer charges". Such amounts, when collected by the several municipal collectors or receivers of taxes, shall be paid over to the County Treasurer. All of the provisions of the tax laws of the State of New York covering the enforcement and collection of unpaid taxes or assessments for special improvements not inconsistent herewith shall apply to the collection of such unpaid charges. Such amounts, when received by the County Treasurer, shall be credited to the County Sewer District fund for the District's exclusive use.

SECTION 9 - PROCEDURES

Resolution 174-77, as amended by Resolution 174-09, shall govern the Commissioners' consideration, adoption and publication of this proposed scale of charges. After the Commissioners' actions, the Board of Supervisors shall act upon the published scale and any appeals therefrom as follows:

- (a) Confirmation thereof by a general resolution;
- (b) Amendment and confirmation by a general resolution; or
- (c) Recommitment to the District Commissioners for further study and consideration.
