

ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING
TUESDAY, JANUARY 2, 2015
AT 4:40 P.M., E.S.T.

Board called to order by the Clerk.

Roll call was taken. PRESENT – Patrick Ziegler, Alan Grattidge, Philip C. Barrett, Anita Daly, Richard Lucia, Preston Allen, Jean Raymond, Paul Lent, Paul Lunde, Arthur M. The invocation was given by Thomas N. Wood, III, Chaplain.

On a motion by Mr. Barrett, seconded by Ms. Raymond, Paul Sausville was named Temporary Chairman by a unanimous vote.

Mr. Wright moved to nominate Matthew Veitch as 2015 Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, and he stated the following: “Mr. Chairman it is my honor to nominate Matt Veitch as Chairman of the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors for 2015. Matt and I both joined this Board in 2008 and his leadership skills were apparent right away. Born and raised in Saratoga Springs, Matt comes from a family rich in community service. After graduating from Saratoga Springs High School, Matt went on to receive his Bachelor’s Degree in teaching from Plattsburg State University and his Associates Degree in telecommunications from Pace University. He currently lives in Saratoga Springs with his wife, Stephanie, and his two sons, Jacob and David. He is employed by Verizon Telecommunications. Matt represents the next generation of leaders and understands what Saratoga County needs to keep up in today’s ever changing world. He has been instrumental in moving the County forward by helping to create and also serving as the first Chairman of the Technology Committee. Matt also helped create and served as the first Chairman of the Trails Committee. That Committee has built miles of hiking trails throughout the County and helped expand the Zim Smith Trail. Matt has gotten very involved in every Committee has been assigned and strives to do what is right for Saratoga Springs and Saratoga County. His accessibility and willingness to listen will help make him a strong leader for this Board. Saratoga County has kept the reputation of low taxes, strong job growth and a great quality of life through strong leadership and I am confident this will continue under Matt’s leadership. Saratoga Springs should be proud to have Matt Veitch as a County Supervisor and I am honored to nominate him as Chairman of this Board. Mr. Kinowski said it would be his honor to second the motion. By a unanimous vote, Matthew E. Veitch was appointed Chairman of the Board for 2015.

Mrs. Daly and Mr. Ziegler escorted Mr. Veitch to the podium where he was administered the oath of office, surrounded by his family, by the Honorable James Murphy.

Mr. Veitch asked County Treasurer Andrew Jarosh and his wife to join him at the podium. Mr. Jarosh was administered the oath of office by the Honorable James Murphy. Mr. Jarosh thanked he wife and his family for their support and said he looked forward to serving the constituents of Saratoga County.

Mr. Veitch, before getting into his goals for 2015, first recognized his family, state elected officials, county elected officials and the Saratoga Springs City Council members in attendance. This is the 100th birthday of Saratoga Springs and he is honored to represent the City on the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors in this Centennial year for the City.

“Second, I wish to thank all of my family and friends for being here today. Your attendance here today means so much to me, and I am humbled by your support of my work as Supervisor for the City of Saratoga Springs for all these years. Many of you were at my announcement speech at High Rock Park back in 2007, and I am grateful for your conversation, advice, and counsel.

Lastly, I want to recognize the members of my immediate family that are here today. First, my wife Stephanie. People always say to me, “isn’t it difficult being so busy all the time.” Well, she is the reason why I am able to do what I do, and her task at home is by far the more difficult one. My two sons, Jacob and David were here earlier, they may have eaten all the food from the table for our reception, so hopefully there is some there when we are

done. In addition, my Mother and Father are here, and brothers Greg, with wife Jen, and Paul with wife Kate, and Michael, with his fiancée, Jill. My sister Mary is in Maryland with her family, we are missing her here today. 2015 will be a year of positive transitions for Saratoga County. I want to thank those who have come before me as Chairman, especially Supervisors Wood, Grattidge, and our past Chairman Sausville. For each of us, as Law & Finance Chairman, putting together a budget that both serves our residents, and has as little impact as possible on the taxpayer, is a challenge. You had to deal with some of the most difficult financial situations the County has been in for several decades, and you were able to keep the county moving in the right direction. I give you credit for your patience, resolve, and frankly hard work to help begin the momentum to continue to do the things which make this County great.

Because of the work done over the past years, I am proud to say that we begin 2015 with a budget that did not increase taxes on our residents for the first time in four years. We have also begun to restore our unappropriated fund balance to a level that gives us some measure of financial stability in our budget. Because of this, we were able to move some initiatives forward, like restoring \$250,000 to our Farmland and Open Space Protection fund; for the first time appropriating \$100,000 to trails initiatives; restoring a portion of funding to the Saratoga County Chamber of Commerce for their Tourism Promotion efforts; to increasing funding for our Southern Chamber in their efforts promoting the businesses in that part of our County; to adding funds for Saratoga County to join the National Association of Counties, to take advantage of federal purchasing discounts and to keep abreast of how Federal laws and programs affect us here in Saratoga County. We will be promoting our agriculture by updating the Saratoga County Farm Guide, which has been in need of an update for several years now. The County will be a partner in hosting a reception at the Saratoga Springs City Center for our Vietnam Veterans, and we will be reinstating our popular Veteran's Concert later this year. And lastly, we were able to fund \$5,000 for the Saratoga Springs Centennial, and in fact we kicked-off the City's Centennial year by helping to sponsor the fireworks for First Night just a day ago. These are some of the things we were able to provide to our County this year, since our financial condition has improved.

Many of the things I will now discuss are transitions from work done as well under my predecessors. First, I want to mention the progress we have made with our new economic development corporation, the Saratoga County Prosperity Partnership. Last year, after adopting the County's first ever Economic Development Strategic Plan, we created the corporation, and recruited some of Saratoga County's finest leaders in business, education, agriculture, and government to serve as its inaugural Board of Directors. My colleague, Supervisor Lawler from the town of Waterford, has done a great job of getting the group off the ground. In 2015 the partnership will hire a President drawn from a national search of those with the best talent. This individual will begin to move the Partnership forward, so we can work with, and effectively serve each of the communities of this County with the economic development tools and support they need, so we can continue the stellar growth we have achieved as a County. The liaison from the County to the Partnership will be Supervisor Art Johnson, from the town of Wilton, whom I have chosen to Chair our Economic Development Committee for this year.

In 2012 we needed to make some tough choices regarding our nursing home, Maplewood Manor. For decades, we were losing money to the tune of as much as \$40,000 per day, which equates to over \$14 million per year. The choices were stark: close the facility, and stop providing an essential, and needed County service; Make major cutbacks to the workforce or raise property taxes by double digits for our residents; or privatize the facility. In 2013, we moved to privatize, and we are very close to completing the transfer to the Zenith Healthcare group. Their approval from the State Department of Health to purchase the facility just went through this week. The Maplewood Manor LDC and Zenith Healthcare are currently working toward establishing a closing date which will essentially transfer ownership and control of facility operations to Zenith. I want to thank both Supervisor Ed Kinowski, who has chaired the Public Health Committee these past two years, and Supervisor Mo Wright, who chairs the Maplewood Manor LDC that facilitated the sale. Since we are transitioning this facility to new ownership, I have asked Supervisor Kevin Tollisen from Halfmoon to now take over the Public Health Committee Chairmanship, as we look at both our Public Health and Mental Health departments going forward.

Last year, we began a process to change how we handle the County recycling program. Saratoga County was one of the early NYS counties to do a recycling program back in 1988. We did multi-stream recycling, where each type of recyclable material is separated, and then put in separate bins for delivery to the processing facility. Over the past years, this outdated process was costing the County up to \$500,000 per year. Our costs to run the program were not keeping up with the revenues generated by the sale of the recyclables. As many of you may now do,

single-stream recycling, where all recyclables are placed in one bin and then separated at a processing facility, is more efficient, easier to understand, and cost effective to run. The County agreed to privatize this service with County Waste, and we will begin the program next month. I wish to thank Supervisor Jean Raymond for her oversight of this transition, and I welcome Supervisor Alan Grattidge to the Post of Chairman of Public Works.

One of the initiatives that I have played a role in at the County over the past several years, is Technology. A few short years ago, things looked pretty bad. Paper-based systems, IT infrastructure that was literally being held together with duct tape, poorly functioning and out of date computers, monitors, and other peripheral devices, all spoke to a need to focus on this and make it a County priority. In 2013 we implemented an electronic time card system, which did away with the paper-based process we were using to record employee time. Last year, we put several hundred thousand dollars into our IT infrastructure, and we will be doing more of that work this year. I am proud to say, things are working much better. Additionally, all the working computers in our facilities Countywide were upgraded, we have Wi-Fi in this room, available to the public, we are using our e-mail systems more effectively, we try to use less paper whenever possible, and we are generally operating more efficiently by using technology. I felt the time was right to transition our formerly advisory Technology Committee to a full-fledged standing committee, and I have asked Supervisor Dan Lewza to be its first chairman. He and his committee will be tasked with looking at ways we can make our County operations even more efficient through technology, and to work with our Data Processing department to implement any recommendations that are made.

The last item I wish to focus on in 2015, and certainly not the least, is Public Safety. Today, there is so much out there and it is a hot topic on the minds of many of us for various reasons. I have asked Supervisor Phil Barrett from Clifton Park to continue his chairmanship of this committee for 2015. My task for the committee, working alongside our Sheriff, is to evaluate all aspects of the department, from the patrols, to prisoner transports, to dispatching as well as the County Jail. Our Sheriff is to be commended for many efficiencies and cost-saving measures he has put into place in the department, but there is more to be done. With the looming heroin epidemic and how we handle this growing threat to our citizens; to looking into body cameras for our Deputies; to upgrading our substations, we need to examine how we spend our public dollars on the protection of our residents. My hope is that solid recommendations come from this committee in 2015, and we do what we can through our process to make any necessary changes that need to be made.

These are not the only things we will be working on in 2015. As I have mentioned several times in my remarks today, we are in a transitional period at the County. We transitioned to a new Sheriff, County Coroner and County Clerk last year; we are transitioning to a new County Treasurer and District Attorney this year. In addition, no less than six departments have new or will be getting new department heads. It's an exciting time to be here at Saratoga County.

I would be remiss if I did not thank all the department heads, and by extension all County employees, for the work you do each day serving our residents. I know I can be confident in my leadership because of the great team we have here. I'm looking forward to working directly with each of you this year.

I want to personally recognize our County Administrator, Spencer Hellwig, Deputy County Administrator Ryan Moore, County Attorney Steve Dorsey, and our Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, Pam Wright, for all your hard work during the budget process and getting things ready for today's meeting.

Lastly, a message to my colleagues on the board. It has been my privilege to serve with you over the past seven years here at the County Board of Supervisors. We all serve our local communities every day, and I see this group all as leaders within our County, coming together to do great things. I firmly hold the philosophy that issues that arise in government are not specific to any one particular person, party, or group. They are just issues, that we are elected by the residents to solve. So as we begin our work for 2015, my hope is that we will be mindful of our stewardship over the County, and act as a deliberative body, making prudent decisions together, for the good of all our residents. Each one of you has been extremely gracious, supportive, and helpful as I have risen through the ranks of our board. I will pledge to you that I will do the best job I can, as the Chairman of the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors, in 2015.

Chairman Veitch asked the County Attorney to present the Rules of the Board. Mr. Dorsey presented the rules and told of the changes made for 2015. On a motion by Mr. Richardson, seconded by Mr. Lunde the Rules of the Board were adopted by a unanimous vote.

RULES OF THE BOARD

1. The Board shall convene for its regular and Agenda meetings in its room at Ballston Spa, New York, as follows:

(a) The Board shall convene for its regular meeting at 4:00 o'clock in the afternoon of the third Tuesday of every month, unless a different time shall have been determined at a previous meeting. The Board's regular meeting for February shall convene at 4:00 o'clock in the afternoon of the fourth Tuesday.

(b) The Board shall convene at 5:00 o'clock in the afternoon of the Wednesday preceding the Board's regular meeting for the purpose of setting the agenda for its regular monthly meeting. The Board's Agenda meeting for February shall convene at 5:00 p.m. in the afternoon of the second Wednesday of the month. The Vice-Chair of the Board shall preside at the Agenda meeting.

(c) Meetings shall be called to order as soon thereafter as a quorum is present.

2. The order of business at regular and Agenda meetings shall be as follows:

a. Regular Meetings:

1. Calling of the roll of members
2. Approval of minutes of prior meetings
3. Presentation of petitions and communications
4. Reports of committees
5. Motions, resolutions and notices
6. Miscellaneous and unfinished business

b. Agenda Meetings:

1. Calling the roll of members
2. Approval of minutes of prior meetings
3. Recitation of proposed Agenda approved by Law and Finance Committee
4. Motions and notices
5. Any other business

3. The Board shall be called to order by the Chair and the roll called. A quorum being present, the minutes of previous meetings, when available, shall be approved and any errors therein shall be corrected. A quorum shall be defined as being at least 12 members present representing over one-half of the Board's total weighted vote.

4. Any member who enters the room after the roll call shall be entitled to take a seat after being recognized by the Chair, and the Clerk shall note the member's presence in the minutes.

5. No member shall withdraw from the session without leave being granted by the Chair.

6. The following rules shall govern the appearance of persons who desire to address the Board of Supervisors or any of its Committees:

(a) Any person may address any Committee meeting with twenty-four (24) hours' prior notice to the Chair of such Committee. The Chair may waive the prior notice requirement.

(b) No person shall be permitted to address a regular, Agenda or special meeting of the Board of Supervisors unless twenty-four (24) hours' prior notice is given to the Clerk of the Board setting forth the identity of such person or organization and the nature of the subject matter to be presented to the Board. Regardless of the provisions set forth herein relating to twenty-four (24) hours' prior notice, any person shall be permitted to address a meeting of the Board with the approval of a majority of the total weighted votes of the Board.

(c) Any person wishing to speak at a public hearing held by the Board must sign their name and address on a sign-up sheet for speakers on the date and at the time of the scheduled public hearing. Oral comments will be limited to three (3) minutes. Speakers will be called in the order in which they sign up. Speaking time may not be transferred from one speaker to another. All written comments will be accepted and included in the minutes of the hearing.

(d) Consistent with Rule 9, no person may hold the floor at the Board meeting for more than five (5) minutes without the permission of the Chair. Speaking time may not be saved nor transferred from one speaker to another.

(e) The Chair of the Board and of each Committee shall have the right to establish other rules and reasonable time limits governing the appearance of persons before the Board and/or respective Committees.

7. All resolutions presented to the Board shall be in writing with the name of the member(s) presenting such appearing thereon, and the Clerk shall enter the names of the moving members in the minutes.

8. Final action shall not be taken on the annual budget until at least ten (10) days shall have elapsed after a printed or typewritten copy thereof shall have been placed on the desk of each Supervisor.

9. No member shall be allowed to debate upon any report, resolution or notice, or amendment or subsidiary motions thereto, for a longer period than five (5) minutes without the consent of the majority of the members present.

10. All resolutions and reports of Committees shall be numbered consecutively by the Clerk as presented.

11. The ayes and noes shall be recorded on all resolutions and reports of committees, and on any question, the ayes and noes shall be recorded if requested by any member. Such votes shall be recorded in accordance with Local Law 2-68, as amended, which establishes the weighted vote of each member. Any member may request a separate vote on any resolution. A request for a separate vote shall not require a second.

12. The following standing Committees shall be appointed by the Chair:

- Buildings and Grounds. 7 Members
- Economic Development. 7 Members
- Equalization and Assessment. 7 Members
- Law and Finance. 7 Members
- Legislative and Research. 7 Members
- Personnel & Insurance Committee. 7 Members
- Public Health. 7 Members
- Public Safety. 7 Members
- Public Works. 7 Members
- Racing Committee. 7 Members
- Social Programs. 7 Members
- Technology. 7 Members
- Veterans Affairs. 7 Members

13. The Chair of the Board shall be a member ex-officio of all Committees, and the Clerk of the Board shall be directly responsible to the Chair. With respect to all standing Committees, a quorum shall consist of a simple majority of its members. Whenever a quorum of a standing Committee is at a meeting properly called or provided for, a majority vote of the members present shall be sufficient to make the act the act of the Committee.

14. When any standing Committee is acting on matters affecting only a single Town or City, or is engaged in obtaining rights of way, the Supervisor or Supervisors of the Town or City affected shall be a member of said Committee.

15. All resolutions to be presented for consideration of the Board shall, so far as possible and practicable, be delivered to the Clerk by 12:00 o'clock Noon on the Monday preceding the Board meeting. The Clerk will prepare an agenda of resolutions and place a copy on the desk of each Supervisor prior to the opening of the meeting. Any resolution not so presented may be considered by the Board during the "Miscellaneous and unfinished business" portion of the Board's meeting agenda upon the motion of any Supervisor, which is duly seconded.

16. At the Organization meeting of the Board, held in accordance with the provisions of §151 of the County Law, the Board shall select a Chair and a Vice-Chair. In the absence of the Chair, the Vice-Chair shall assume the duties of the Chair. The duties to be performed by the Vice-Chair shall be as follows:

- (a) preside over each duly constituted meeting of the Board;
- (b) have and exercise all the powers and duties of the Chair at any meeting over which the Vice-Chair is called to preside;
- (c) execute as Acting Chair any and all documents and agreements authorized to be executed By the Chair of the Board of Supervisors
- (d) have and exercise those additional powers and duties authorized by Resolution of the

Board, provided such Resolution shall specify:

- (i) the dates during which such Vice-Chair may exercise those powers and duties; and
- (ii) that the powers and duties authorized to such Vice-Chair shall not be exercised by the Chair during that designated time period.

17. The duties and functions of the standing Committees of the Board shall be as follows:

1. BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS COMMITTEE: To have charge of all County property, its use, maintenance, renovation, space allocation, repairs and replacement, including maintenance operation or development of the Saratoga County Airport; to oversee and approve all lease agreements involving the County of Saratoga; to oversee parking regulations and facilities; and supervise the provision of construction, technical, engineering and legal services necessary or appropriate for construction of County facilities.

2. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE: To have supervision over County planning matters and activities as provided under §220 of the County Law and Article 12(b) of the General Municipal Law; to meet periodically with the County Planning Board for the purpose of correlating its activities and objectives; to have general cognizance of all matters relating to the preservation and improvement of the environment; to maintain liaison with the Environmental Management Council; generally managing and dealing with all matters of transportation, excluding those assigned to the Public Works Committee; to act as liaison with the Capital District Transportation Authority; to handle matters under the Mass Transportation Act; to develop, as the need arises, long range plans affecting any forms of transportation within the County; to work in conjunction with various County publicity and promotion committees in fostering continuous publicity for the County and to formulate a County promotion program; to consult with industrial and business firms regarding matters of mutual interest and concern; to assist local efforts to attract new business and industry to the County in a continuous effort to improve the commercial and industrial climate of the area; to foster the creation and oversee the implementation of a Saratoga County Economic Development Strategic Plan; to have general supervision over the operations of the County's Office of Employment and Training; to meet periodically with and to maintain liaison with appropriate economic development organizations and to make such recommendations to the Board of Supervisors as it deems in the best interests of the County; to have general cognizance of all matters relating to preservation and improvement of agriculture and husbandry, propagation of fish and game birds, reforestation projects and care of trees, forest fires, bounties, soil conservation, extension service, and to meet periodically and maintain liaison with Boards of Directors of County Extension Association, Soil Conservation District and County Fair.

3. EQUALIZATION AND ASSESSMENT COMMITTEE: To examine the assessment rolls of the Towns and Cities of the County; to complete totals on assessment rolls; to recommend equalization rates to be set for each Town and City; to have general supervision over all matters relating to equalization, taxation and assessment; to meet regularly with the Director of Real Property Tax Services relative to the County's tax maps; to have general supervision of lands that are potential County tax acquisitions; to recommend to the Board the sale or retention of such lands when in the best interest of the County to do so.

4. LAW AND FINANCE COMMITTEE: To have general supervision over all matters where County funds, Rules of the Board or laws are concerned; to review the tentative Annual Budget for the consideration of the Board; to have general supervision over matters pertaining to the offices of County Auditor, Budget Officer, County Treasurer, County Clerk and County Attorney; to supervise negotiations with employees organizations; to coordinate Committee programs and to make recommendations relative to office management, equipment and personnel; to have initial jurisdiction over all referred matters not specifically within the jurisdiction of another Committee, and to confer with the Chair and members of a Committee when a matter overlaps or infringes on the functions of such Committee.

5. LEGISLATIVE AND RESEARCH COMMITTEE: To confer with members of other legislative bodies; to urge such bodies to approve or disapprove legislation affecting the County of Saratoga; to attend sessions of other legislative bodies, particularly the State Legislature; to examine all proposed legislation affecting the County or any of its subdivisions; to report to the Board for its approval or disapproval of such legislation; to maintain liaison with Boards of Supervisors of other counties; to promote, chart and improve the scope, efficiency, effectiveness and economy of County government and to recommend means of improving the coordination of the entire County operation and of its various departments with each other.

6. PERSONNEL & INSURANCE COMMITTEE: To have general supervision over all county personnel matters; to have charge of safety concerns regarding county personnel and property; to have charge of a County Risk Management Program; to have jurisdiction over all county liability insurance; to supervise county compliance with the Occupational Safety and Health Act; to have jurisdiction over the Saratoga County Self

Insurance Plan and to advise and assist the Self Insurance Administrator in the management of the Self Insurance Plan; to oversee and make recommendations regarding the creation, abolishment and reclassification of job descriptions and regarding the functions, staffing and salaries for county departments; and to review and evaluate compensation and performance of county employees who are not members of collective bargaining units, including county officials and department heads.

7. PUBLIC HEALTH COMMITTEE: To oversee generally all County health programs, including the Physically Handicapped Children's program; to consult with the County Community Services Board; to have general supervision over the operation of Saratoga County Maplewood Manor and to meet regularly with its Administrator and, when necessary, representatives of the State Department of Health.

8. PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE: To have supervision over County matters pertaining to the Courts and law enforcement agencies, including the Sheriff's department, District Attorney, Supreme, County, Surrogate and Family Courts, Public Defender, Probation department, Supreme Court Library, Commissioner of Jurors, Civil Defense, Emergency Services communications and operation of the County Animal Shelter.

9. PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE: To consider all requests and recommendations made by the County Commissioner of Public Works as to order and type of roads to be constructed, programs and projects for road construction, reconstruction or maintenance; snow and ice control; purchase of machinery; acquisition of rights of way for State and County highways; to confer with State officials with reference to location of proposed State highways within the County; to provide requested engineering services to other County departments; and to supervise the County's recycling program and solid waste disposal, and the maintenance and operation of the County Landfill.

10. RACING AND GAMING COMMITTEE: To consider matters related to the horse racing and electronic gaming industries in Saratoga County and to oversee and develop County policies and activities in support of the racing and electronic gaming industries in Saratoga County; and to consider matters related to the siting and operation of a gambling casino in Saratoga County and to make such recommendations to the Board of Supervisors as it deems in the best interests of the County.

11. SOCIAL PROGRAMS COMMITTEE: To have general supervision over the operations of all agencies and departments now or hereafter involved with social programs, including the Social Services department, Office for the Aging and Youth Bureau; to maintain liaison with federal and state agencies in connection with such programs; to recommend any changes in personnel or appropriations required for the efficient operation of the said County departments; to hear any member's recommendations to the Board of Supervisors in connection therewith; to explore all federal and/or state social programs applicable to the County, its departments or municipalities; to make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors as to the advisability of County participation and to forward pertinent data thereon to other interested County municipalities.

12. TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE: To oversee all aspects of County Internet Technology (IT) and Data Processing; to oversee the County's IT infrastructure; to evaluate and recommend potential software solutions requested by County management personnel through the County Administrator's Office for the purpose of making County operations more efficient and/or cost effective; to consider recommendations of the Director of Data Processing; and to discuss generally the public's access to Internet Technology in Saratoga County.

13. VETERANS AFFAIRS COMMITTEE: To oversee all programs for military veterans throughout the County; to confer with members of other legislative bodies on appropriate benefits for military veterans; to conduct suitable events to honor and memorialize veterans.
