WHEREAS, the lease between the County and NAFS requires NAFS to obtain the prior written approval of the County: 1) to any proposed sublet of the leased premises by NAFS; and 2) to any improvements, alterations, repairs or changes to the leased premises by NAFS; and

WHEREAS, our Buildings and Grounds Committee has recommended that the proposed sublease to RYH Enterprises, LLC, and the proposed alterations to convert a portion of the Maintenance/Operations Hanger to a café, be approved, subject to certain terms and conditions; now, therefore, be it

OPPOSING PROPOSED FEDERAL LEGISLATION TO REPEAL THE INTERSTATE HORSERACING ACT OF 1978

WHEREAS, in an effort to combat the administration of performance enhancing and dangerous drugs to racehorses across the country, United States Senator Tom Udall of New Mexico and United States Representative Joe Pitts of Pennsylvania have introduced legislation in the U.S. Congress to repeal the Interstate Horseracing Act of 1978; and

WHEREAS, the Interstate Horseracing Act of 1978, as amended in 2000, authorizes off-track betting at locations other than racetracks, and allows pari-mutuel wagering by telephone and over the Internet; and

WHEREAS, Senator Udall's bill, entitled the "Teller All Gone Horseracing Deregulation Act of 2015" and Representative Pitts' bill, entitled the "Coronado Heights Deregulation Act of 2015" are named after racehorses who sustained fatal injuries while racing; and

WHEREAS, in the 38 states that allow off-track and online wagering, which include New York State, it is estimated that of the \$11 billion wagered on horseracing, 90% of said amount is wagered at off-track locations and over the Internet; and

WHEREAS, the National Thoroughbred Horseracing Association has issued a statement strongly opposing the bills introduced by Senator Udall and Representatives Pitts, stating that the proposed legislation "threatens to destroy the economic vitality of the \$26 billion horseracing industry and the 380,000 jobs it supports nationwide"; and

WHEREAS, The Jockey Club has also taken a position opposing the proposed legislation, stating "The Interstate Horseracing Act of 1978 is the lifeblood of the industry, and we strongly oppose any effort to repeal it"; and

WHEREAS, the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association has issued a statement on behalf of its nearly 30,000 members, stating "The National HBPA believes opposing this legislation, or any similar legislation, will be critical to the economic viability of not only the Thoroughbred racing industry, but the equine industry as a whole"; and

WHEREAS, while this Board of Supervisors opposes the administration of banned performance enhancing drugs to racehorses for the purpose of gaining an unfair competitive advantage, the federal legislation proposed by Senator Udall and Representative Pitts is a misdirected and misguided attempt to correct that problem; and

WHEREAS, the repeal of the Interstate Horseracing Act of 1978 would have a devastating financial impact on racing in New York State and at the Saratoga Race Track, and will effect severe and long-term financial consequences upon the economies of Saratoga County and the City of Saratoga Springs; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the form and content of such deed of easement and related documents shall be subject to the approval of the County Attorney.

DECLARING THE COUNTY'S INTENT TO CONTINUE TO SERVE AS LEAD AGENCY FOR THE PROPOSED CONSOLIDATION AND EXPANSION OF THE FINCH WASTE CO. LLC LANDFILL

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 134 of 1991, the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors declared its intent to serve as SEQRA lead agency for purposes of the County siting, designing, permitting, constructing and operating a Landfill on Kobor Road in the Town of Northumberland; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 128-13, the County declared its intent to continue to serve as SEQRA lead agency in connection with the planned sale and privatization of the Saratoga County Landfill; and

WHEREAS, the County completed the sale of the County Landfill to Finch Paper LLC on January 24, 2014; and

WHEREAS, Finch Waste Co. LLC, successor in interest to Finch Paper LLC, desires to expand and consolidate adjoining landfills owned by Finch in the Town of Northumberland by obtaining from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation a permit to expand its existing landfills by constructing a landfill on the 6.5 acre site between the two landfills, which site is identified as the "Valley Fill" in the Purchase and Sale Agreement executed by the County and Finch Paper LLC for the sale of the County Landfill; and

WHEREAS, consolidation and expansion of the Finch landfills also requires approval of the County Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, representatives of Finch Waste Co. LLC and the Town of Northumberland have expressed their desire that the County continue to serve as SEQRA Lead Agency for the proposed consolidation and expansion of the Finch landfills in the Town of Northumberland; and

WHEREAS, the County has retained the services of the law firm of Miller, Mannix, Schachner & Hafner, LLC, via minor contract, to serve as special counsel to ensure the County's compliance with its legal obligations as lead agency under SEQRA; and

WHEREAS, Finch Waste Co. LLC has provided special counsel with a completed SEQRA Full Environmental Assessment Form, Part 1 (EAF) for the proposed landfill consolidation and expansion; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this Board of Supervisors hereby declares its intent to continue to serve as lead agency with respect to the proposed consolidation and expansion of the Finch Waste Co. LLC Landfill in the Town of Northumberland; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that this Board of Supervisors authorizes and directs special counsel Miller, Mannix, Schachner and Hafner, LLC to provide the draft EAF to all involved agencies and to notify said involved agencies of this Board's intent to continue to serve as lead agency.

AUTHORIZING THE CHAIRMAN TO ENTER INTO AN AMENDED AGREEMENT WITH ENVIRONMENTAL DESIGN PARTNERSHIP, LLP FOR ADDITIONAL DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION SERVICES AT THE SEWER DISTRICT NO. 1'S MILTON PUMP STATION

WHEREAS, Resolution 94-13 authorized an agreement with Environmental Design Partnership, LLP at a cost not to exceed \$83,350 for engineering services for certain repairs and improvements to Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1's Milton Pump Station, including the replacement of sewer pumps, the upgrading of the station's electrical system, and the addition of a septage receiving station; and

WHEREAS, during the course of the design phase of the project, unanticipated design and construction issues arose which necessitated incurring additional design, construction administration and construction inspection services, which issues included: having to rebid the project due to a lack of participation from HVAC

contractors; designing a new overhead crane system; required access gate revisions, and a building classification rating change due to the installation of septage equipment which required, among other things, new explosion proof electrical equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Saratoga County Sewer District Commission and the Sewer District's Executive Director have recommended that the contract with Environmental Design Partnership, LLP (EDP) be amended to include the additional design and construction services provided and/or to be provided by EDP at a cost not to exceed \$57,700; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board is authorized to execute an amended agreement with Environmental Design Partnership, LLP of Clifton Park, New York, for additional design and construction services relative to the upgrades to the Milton Pump Station, at a cost not to exceed \$57,700, thereby increasing the overall contract amount to \$141,050, with the form and content of said amended agreement being subject to the approval of the County Attorney.

<u>BUDGET IMPACT STATEMENT</u>: No budget impact. Additional service costs will be covered by savings in other capital projects.

REQUESTING HOME RULE LEGISLATION TO AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY OF SARATOGA AND THE SARATOGA COUNTY WATER AUTHORITY TO EFFECTUATE A LOT LINE ADJUSTMENT INVOLVING A PORTION OF REFORESTED LANDS IN THE TOWN OF MOREAU

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 439 of 2006 of the Laws of the State of New York, and Resolution 128-07 of the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors, the County conveyed to the Saratoga County Water Authority (SCWA) a 21.86 acre parcel of County owned reforested land on Butler Road in the Town of Moreau for the construction of a water treatment plant to service a County Water System to be owned and operated by SCWA; and

WHEREAS, due to the fact the County was conveying the 21.86 acre reforested parcel to SCWA for a purpose other than reforestation or a purpose otherwise authorized by County Law §219, it was necessary for the County to obtain home rule legislation in the form of Chapter 439 of 2006 of the Laws of the State of New York to authorize the conveyance, which conveyance was conditioned upon the County creating an equivalent sized parcel of County-owned reforested land in the Town of Providence; and

WHEREAS, the County conveyed said 21.86 acre parcel to SCWA by deed recorded in the Saratoga County Clerk's Office on March 24, 2008 as Instrument #2008010290, which parcel is currently identified on the Saratoga County tax maps as Tax Parcel #62.-1-12.2; and

WHEREAS, SCWA constructed a water treatment plant and necessary appurtenances on Tax Parcel #62.-1-12.2; and

WHEREAS, in the course of designing needed improvements and upgrades to its water treatment plant, SCWA recently discovered that portions of its water treatment facility, as constructed, enter onto the adjoining reforested lands of the County (Tax Parcel #62.-1-12.1); and

WHEREAS, the County and SCWA propose to remedy SCWA's entry onto the County's reforested lands by a lot line adjustment that: 1) extends the westerly boundary of SCWA's parcel by 180 ft. x 1234.62 ft., consisting of approximately 5 acres of land currently owned by the County, and being a portion of Tax Parcel #62.-1-12.1; and 2) shortens the southerly boundary of SCWA's parcel by 370 ft. x 600 ft., consisting of approximately 5 acres of land currently owned by SCWA, and being a portion of Tax Parcel #62.-1-12.2, which will be restored to the ownership of the County and re-designated as County reforested land; and

WHEREAS, the additional acreage to be added through the extension of the westerly boundary of SCWA's parcel is necessary to the improvement of the water treatment plant's efficiency and operations; and

WHEREAS, the SCWA has obtained the approval of the Town of Moreau to the proposed lot line adjustment; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 65-2015, this Board of Supervisors requested home rule legislation:

- 1) authorizing the County of Saratoga and the Saratoga County Water Authority to effectuate a lot line adjustment that:
 - a) extends the westerly boundary of Tax Parcel #62.-1-12.2, owned by SCWA, by 180 ft. in width and 1234.62 ft. in length to include approximately 5 acres of reforested land currently owned by the County and being a portion of Tax Parcel #62.-1-12.1; and
 - b) shortens the southerly boundary of Tax Parcel #62.-1-12.2, owned by SCWA, by 370 ft. in length and 600 ft. in width to return to the County's ownership approximately 5 acres of land that will be restored to reforestation purposes and included within the boundaries of Tax Parcel #62.-1-12.1; and
- 2) amending Chapter 439 of 2006 of the Laws of the State of New York to revise accordingly the legal description of former reforested lands authorized to be conveyed by the County to SCWA to be as stated in the Schedule A attached thereto; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill No. A7293-A and Senate Bill No. S5024-A have been introduced in the State Legislature and would authorize the lot line adjustment requested by Resolution 69-2015; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors requests the enactment by the New York State Legislature of Assembly Bill No. A7293-A and Senate Bill No. S5024-A entitled "An Act authorizing the Saratoga County Water Authority, County of Saratoga, to effectuate a lot line adjustment involving a portion of reforested lands in the Town of Moreau"; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that a necessity exists for the enactment of such legislation due to the fact that the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors does not have the power to enact such legislation solely by local law; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Board forward certified copies of this Resolution to our local State legislators.

BUDGET IMPACT STATEMENT: No budget impact.

Mr. Veitch introduced and congratulated Mrs. McNamara on her appointment to the Director of Personnel position. He also introduced Mr. Kuhn who was appointed as Saratoga County Coroner through the end of the year.
