# **SOCIAL PROGRAMS**

Authorize an agreement with Captain Youth and Family Services to administer a Safe Harbor Grant that the County accepted last month to provide training and other services for runaway and homeless youth in Saratoga County.

### ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Approval for the County to apply for, accept and administer a New York State Snowmobile grant from the NYS Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation.

Authorize amendments to the boundaries of Saratoga County consolidated Agricultural Districts #1 and #2.

Authorizing the County to enter into an agreement with the Town of Moreau and BOCES to allow them to enter County trail ways to perform various trail maintenance and other tasks.

Authorizing the Chairman to enter into a multi-jurisdictional agreement with Warren and Washington Counties for the purposes of appointing members to the Workforce Investment Board.

### PUBLIC SAFETY

Acceptance of a grant from the NYS Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Services. The grant will be used to replace equipment including the air bank at the Saratoga Springs Fire Department and radios as well as underwrite the costs associated with the 'I Am Responding' services for the next two years.

Designating the month of October as Domestic Violence Awareness month.

#### **PUBLIC WORKS**

Authorizing the implementation and funding in the first instance for the federal and state "Marschiselli" program and eligible costs related to design services for the repaving of County Road 31 in the Town of Moreau. The local share of the \$57,000 is \$2,800 which represents the County's cost.

Authorization for an agreement with Greenman Pederson, Inc. to perform the design work of the repaving of County Road 31 in the Town of Moreau.

## **PUBLIC HEALTH**

Accepting \$35,929 from the NYS Office of Alcohol and Substance Abuse Services and \$285 from the NYS Office of Mental Health. The \$35,929 will be used by the Prevention Council of Saratoga to lease additional

space as well as to underwrite the costs associated with replacing some furniture at the facility and the \$285 will be used for COLA on salaries for Northeast Parent and Child Society as well as Unlimited Potential.

#### PERSONNEL & INSURANCE

Authorizing the renewal of the consultant agreement with Marshall & Sterling, Inc. That agreement will be extended through the remainder of 2015 at the current annual cost of \$60,000. From 2016 through 2018 the cost will increase to \$63,000 for that three year period.

Authorizing a health insurance contract with Blue Shield of Northeastern New York for medical and prescription health insurance policies. After a relatively lengthy review by the Committee's subcommittee the recommendation was to award the contract to Blue Shield at a cost of \$21,339,122.

Authorizing a dental contract with MetLife at an annual cost of \$492,307. That is a savings of about \$11,000 over the expiring agreement.

Authorizing an agreement with Mohawk Valley Physicians Health Care for all Medicare eligible retirees accessing coverage under the County's health insurance contracts at a cost of \$2,133,689 which represents a 5.6% reduction over the expiring premium.

Appointing Daniel W. Rourke P.E. as the Executive Director of the Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1. Mr. Rourke was selected from a group of 6 candidates that were interviewed.

Amending the Compensation Schedule to change the position title of Animal Shelter Supervisor to Animal Shelter Director and create one position of Deputy Animal Shelter Director. The Deputy Animal Shelter Director position came out of discussions amongst the Personnel Subcommittee as well as the Committee itself; based on the growing operation as well as administrative demands of the facility, a Deputy Director position was an appropriate addition at this time. There is another position in that Department that will be left vacant and the savings from that position will offset a portion of the increased cost of this new position.

Appointing Jason C. Hayes as the Animal Shelter Director. Mr. Hayes is currently managing operations at the Mohawk Hudson Humane Society in Menands and was one of five candidates that interviewed for the job. His name was brought forth and recommended.

Appointing Kyran Nigro as the Saratoga County Conflict Defender. The existing Conflict Defender did leave this position to take a position with the State as a result of this the Personnel Committee has been actively searching for a replacement and has selected Mr. Nigro.

# **EQUALIZATION & ASSESSMENT**

Correcting the 2013 and 2014 tax rolls for a parcel in the Town of Corinth.

Accepting tender offers on parcels that were currently or previously on the auction list for September 15<sup>th</sup>. The property owners have paid the outstanding taxes, penalties and interest.

### **LAW & FINANCE**

Authorizing an amendment to the agreement with GHD to provide additional engineering services associated with the Incinerator Alternative Study.

Authorizing the Chairman to enter into an agreement with Pace Environmental for services associated with compliance testing, equipment rental, and equipment repair for the Sewer District's sludge incinerator.

On a motion by Mr. Richardson, seconded by Mr. Martin the agenda was unanimously set for the September 15, 2015 Board Meeting.

Mr. Wright introduced Daniel Rourke the candidate for the Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1's Executive Director's position as well as Jason Hayes the candidate for the Director of the Saratoga County Animal Shelter.

The invocation was given by Thomas N. Wood, III, Chaplain.

#### PUBLIC INPUT:

Pam Morin, Warren County Planning Department Re: Upper Hudson River Waterfront Map – Ms. Morin brought along Peter Bardunias from the Southern Chamber and thanked him for his help with this map. Ms. Morin stated she provided Supervisors with copies of the map in their boxes in the Board offices. She said she is going to be going to each Town Hall. She said if anyone catches an error please let her know and she will be sure it is corrected. Ms. Morin thanked the Town of Hadley and the Town of Corinth for their support with this effort. She gave an update on First Wilderness.

Cynthia Broz, City of Saratoga Springs Re: Animal Shelter – Ms. Broz said she used to be a volunteer trainer at the Animal Shelter and thinks there is a Personnel problem there. She said the problem is with three Union employees and believes they are not good advocates for the shelter. Ms. Broz believes that the volume of complaints submitted by these employees is part of the reason the past Director is no longer there. She said she has further comments that she will make to Mr. Barrett. She said the shelter is a community shelter and opposes any time limit set on the animals housed there.

Eric Spaulding, City of Saratoga Springs, Re: Animal Shelter – Mr. Spaulding said he is the owner of Priceless Companion Pets Services and a volunteer at the Animal Shelter. He said the County is blessed to have this facility but feels it is not being used to its potential. He believes the past shelter director was qualified for the job and the programs she brought got animals adopted. Since her departure these programs have been halted. Mr. Spaulding said veteran staff have not been easy to work with or supportive of these programs. He said the volunteers walk the dogs because the staff is not meeting the minimum requirements of walking dogs.

Karissa DeSofi, City of Saratoga Springs, Re: Animal Shelter – Ms. DeSofi shared her past experience of adopting a dog which she adopted in July of 2010. She spoke of the holding policy and how it affected the adoption which she said was miserable. Ms. DeSofi said that since then she has volunteered as a dog walker and has found the long term staff to be rude. Mr. Barrett asked for clarification for the time frame for the adoption process that she had problems with. She said July of 2010.

Jane Sanzen, City of Saratoga Springs, Re: Animal Shelter – Ms. Sanzen said she has been a volunteer at the shelter since 2008. She is protesting the forced resignation of the former director. She said the former director implemented programs that enabled the shelter to increase adoptions which saves the County funds. Ms. Sanzen said the elimination of the programs has caused stress on the animals and volunteers. She said shelter staff complained about walking dogs. She believes public awareness programs should be implemented and the shelter open hours should be extended.

Kyle Waltz, City of Saratoga Springs, Re: Animal Shelter – Mr. Waltz said he is a dog walker for the Animal Shelter. He commended Mr. Barrett for holding office hours at the Shelter. He said he was there to echo the sentiments spoken today. He appreciates the time given to him today and hopes they won't be overlooked today and Supervisors remain open minded.

Sara Ellis, Town of Greenfield, Re: Animal Shelter – Ms. Ellis said she is a business owner in Saratoga Springs, has raised funds for the Shelter and the Friends of the Shelter, and she is a volunteer at the shelter. Ms. Ellis

said she had come to the meeting planning on talking about herself and her experience at the shelter; instead, she read a resignation from a former employee.

Christina Kline, City of Saratoga Springs, Re: Animal Shelter – She said the events that brought her here today have made her sad, hopeful and thankful. Ms. Kline said sad that things have been allowed to deteriorate, hopeful that Supervisors Veitch and Barrett seem ready to seek real solutions and thankful for that. She has been involved with the shelter for 12 years. She began as an adopter, then as a volunteer and most recently as an employee. She has seen the good and the bad and gave examples of that.

Mr. Veitch thanked those who spoke today and said the submissions are taken very seriously. As a Board, the comments will be considered as the Shelter moves forward.

Mr. Barrett said there has been a lot of press about the shelter and wanted to update the Board on what has been going on. He said every day there is action taken. He thanked everyone who was there who volunteers at the shelter for the care and the time they put forward for the animals. Mr. Barrett said there are three things he is looking to accomplish. The first is a desk audit of the positions in that department, review all policies and procedures at the shelter and also examine ways to strengthen relations with the volunteers.

Mr. Barrett said a desk audit is a routine management best practice and in Clifton Park he does them all the time. The shelter is blessed with a pleather of hard working volunteers. The time to perform this type of review is now. If the resolution is passed today, we will have a new director. The meetings he has held during the open hours at the shelter have been helpful. He has met with former employees, volunteers and concerned County residents with many more scheduled.

Mr. Barrett said he has visited the shelter on many occasions unannounced and walked through the shelter. He said he has never witnessed anything but superb care for the animals of Saratoga County. He hasn't been given any evidence that would prove anything different at this point. The meetings he's held have not all been negative and some very positive comments have come from the meetings. This Board of Supervisors has made a very large commitment; time, energy, effort, funds towards the care of Saratoga County animals. There is a multi-million dollar shelter built just a few years ago. The line item in the budget is significant. We have a lot of outreach programs and mobile adoption units.

Mr. Barrett has assured the press and everyone that he has spoken with that that shelter will be run cost effectively. That is the goal for the shelter and to ensure superb care of the animals of Saratoga County. All of the personalities have to be stripped out of the equation and the focus on that mission must occur. Everyone has to be going in the same direction. There is going to be change, a little bit of a culture change, as he believes there should be. The desk audits will be done. Customer service is job one because without the customer your livelihood is in jeopardy.

Mr. Barrett said let's remember what we have here. The County has a tremendous state of the art facility. We have a Board of Supervisors that is totally committed to the superb care of the animals at the shelter.

WHEREAS, the Director of the Youth Bureau proposes to retain the services of CAPTAIN Youth and Family Services to administer the RHY Safe Harbor Grant funds and to organize and conduct the outreach training at the conference to be held on October 29, 2015; and

WHEREAS, our Social Programs Committee has recommended that the County enter into an agreement with CAPTAIN Youth and Family Services to administer the \$35,000 RHY Safe Harbor grant, with CAPTAIN being responsible for contracting with all presenters, vendors and the host facility for the October 29, 2015 conference, purchasing all materials needed for the conference, and providing supportive services for runaway, homeless and sexually exploited youth, subject to reimbursement for such costs from the County utilizing the RHY Safe Harbor grant funds upon submission of appropriate claim forms and supporting documentation; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board, or the Vice-Chair of the Board in the Chair's absence, are hereby authorized to execute an agreement with CAPTAIN Youth and Family Services of Clifton Park, New York, for the administration of a \$35,000 Runaway and Homeless Youth (RHY) Safe Harbor grant by conducting outreach training to agencies involved with runaway, homeless and sexually exploited youth at a conference to be held on October 29, 2015, and by providing necessary supportive services to youth in need; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the form and content of such agreement shall be subject to the approval of the County Attorney.

AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH PACE ENVIRONMENTAL FOR ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES ASSOCIATED WITH COMPLIANCE TESTING, EQUIPMENT RENTAL AND EQUIPMENT REPAIR FOR SARATOGA COUNTY SEWER DISTRICT NO. 1'S SLUDGE INCINERATOR

WHEREAS, Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1 previously awarded a contract to Pace Environmental of Whitehall, Pennsylvania, for environmental services to include performing various mandated compliance tests, certifications and audits on Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1's sludge incinerator, at a cost not to exceed \$8,935; and

WHEREAS, in the course of Pace Environmental performing a Relative Accuracy Testing Audit ("RATA"), the Sewer District's oxygen analyzer failed to function properly, as a result of which Pace had to provide the Sewer District with a rented oxygen analyzer while Pace repaired the Sewer District's analyzer; and

WHEREAS, the Sewer District is prohibited from operating its sludge incinerator without a functioning oxygen analyzer; and

WHEREAS, the Saratoga County Sewer District Commission has recommended that a contract be awarded to Pace Environmental in an amount not the exceed \$40,000, which amount is inclusive of the \$8,935 contract previously awarded to Pace Environmental, for the rental of the oxygen analyzer, the repair of the Sewer District's oxygen analyzer, the installation of the repaired analyzer, the performance of all RATAs needed, the completion of all required compliance testing and certifications, and the provision of related materials and services; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board, or the Vice-Chair of the Board in the Chair's absence, are hereby authorized and directed to execute an agreement with Pace Environmental of Whitehall, Pennsylvania, for the provision of environmental services to include the completion of all government mandated compliance tests, certifications and audits on Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1's sludge incinerator, the rental of an oxygen analyzer, the repair and installation of the Sewer District's oxygen analyzer, and the provision of related materials and services, at a cost not to exceed \$40,000, which amount shall be inclusive of a \$8,935 contract previously awarded Pace for related environmental services; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the form and content of such agreement shall be subject to the approval of the County Attorney.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 230-14, this Board authorized an agreement with GHD Consulting Services, Inc. to conduct an engineering study identifying and evaluating alternatives to the incineration of sludge at the Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1 Wastewater Treatment Plant, at a cost not to exceed \$42,500; and

WHEREAS, the Saratoga County Sewer District Commission has recommended that the County's contract with GHD Consulting Service, Inc. be amended to authorize the provision of additional engineering services to include an updated analysis of the influent solids loading and detailing a phased approach to each of the sludge incineration alternatives based on the updated analysis provided, which recommendation is founded upon the Commission's belief that the phased approach will result in less expensive sludge incineration alternatives due to anticipated lower solids loadings; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board, or the Vice-Chair of the Board in the Chair's absence, are hereby authorized to execute an amendment to the agreement with GHD Consulting Services, Inc. of Cazenovia, New York, for the provision of additional engineering services described hereinabove in connection with the current engineering study identifying and evaluating available alternatives to the incineration of sludge at the Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1 Wastewater Treatment Plant, with such additional services to be provided at a cost not to exceed \$14,000, bringing the total contract amount to \$56,500; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the form and content of such amendment shall be subject to the approval of the County Attorney.

<u>BUDGET IMPACT STATEMENT</u>: None. The costs associated with these services will be covered by savings in other capital projects.
