Report No. 1: 2018 Human Resources and Insurance Committee Annual Report

The Human Resources and Insurance Committee had a successful year in 2018. All members of the committee worked diligently to adapt to changes within the County Departments. As chairman, I was faced with a number of hard decisions to bring to the committee.

The New Year came with new technology for the Department to further improve their operations, in turn improving ability to access benefit administration from the internet site. The payroll administration duties were also transferred to the Human Resources Department so that employees will be able to obtain all benefit/payroll information in one central location.

With the recent influx in allegations dealing with sexual harassment and assault, a new policy was created and the Human Resources Department will ensure all employees are retrained on the updated policy. There will continue to be a zero tolerance stance on this very important issue.

While this year has seen many highlights, there have also been challenging times, as Department Heads requested to restructure their Departments and reclassify positions in accordance with Civil Service Laws. The Human Resources and Insurance Committee has worked hard to look at ways to face the County's budgetary challenges while balancing needs of the Department(s). This will continue into the next fiscal year to revisit how personnel is administered and explore innovative options that can help create efficiencies and streamline processes.

- Authorized the updating of all payroll records with signed union cards for all unionized employees
- Authorized the CSEA Union Contract for 1/1/19-12/31/23
- Authorized Standard Workday Resolutions
- Closed several Worker's Compensation claims
- Three executive sessions were held in regard to employee litigation

Report No. 2: 2018 Economic Development Committee Annual Report

The Economic Development Committee had a successful and busy year in 2018. The committee is charged in our rules with overseeing all aspects of Economic Development, including overseeing the Planning and Employment & Training departments, being the liaison to the County's Economic Development entities and other organizations such as the County Fair and Soil & Water Conservation District; and generally working to promote the County to attract business.

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The committee met monthly in 2018 and many things were accomplished in our meetings. One of the main things that we strove to do was to feature several of our County's large businesses from several business sectors, to inform the committee on their activities over the past several years, and to hear their plans for the future. The committee hosted the following businesses at our meetings:

- GlobalFoundries
- Stewart's Shops
- King Dairy

We thank them for their time in coming to our committee and discussing their businesses with us.

Additionally, our committee received reports from the County's Economic Development agencies:

- Saratoga County Prosperity Partnership
- The Chamber of Southern Saratoga County
- The Saratoga County Chamber of Commerce
- Saratoga County IDA

Additionally, the Board of Supervisors received a presentation from the Saratoga County Soil and Water Conservation district at the August meeting, and I want to thank Chairman Kinowski for arranging and inviting them to the meeting.

I have asked each of our departments to prepare their accomplishments from 2018 and I will attach them here. Both the Planning Department and Employment & Training sent a report:

Highlights of the activities completed by the Planning Department 2018

Saratoga County Planning Board Review

- Planning Department Staff reviewed 277 project applications, with referrals coming from each of Saratoga County's 19 towns, all 9 or its villages and each of its 2 cities.
 - The SCPB and staff reviewed 184 subdivisions, 65 site plans or variance referrals, and reviewed 28 such referrals under the MOUs it has with several municipalities to enhance or expedite the review process of actions presenting little or no countywide impact

Saratoga County Annual Planning and Zoning Conference

- 14th Consecutive year
- Held on January 31, 2018 at the Saratoga Springs City Center
- 560 registrants representing 65 different municipalities from 10 different counties, south from Ulster and Green to Essex and Clinton in the north country and east to west from Washington to Oneida.
- Secured financial sponsorships from 11 entities, 5 of which also joined us as Exhibitors.
- The number of Exhibitor Booths increased over the previous years, now representing 23 various engineering, consulting, and law firms along with a few state and transportation agencies.

Zim Smith Trail

- Completed Design, went to Bid and Awarded Contract for Zim Smith Extension from Coons Crossing to Mechanicville.
- Successfully acquired Right of Way for construction of the trail on 13 parcels (approximately 25 acres) properties totaling \$223,600.
- Secured \$5,150,000 in non-county funds to construct the Zim Smith Trail Extension.
- Provided for a 3-plus mile extension of the existing multi-modal trail from the village of Ballston Spa to the city of Mechanicville

County Farmland and Open Space Program/Trails Grant Program

• 2018 County Farmland Applications and Funding – six applications from five municipalities were received with requests totaling over \$500,000. Four farmland conservation projects were awarded, leveraging \$628,664 in State funding.

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• 2018 Trails Funding and Applications – the department received applications from eight municipalities amounting to \$69,000 in funding requests. All projects were funded.

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- Farmland and Open Space Projects closed five outstanding open space projects with two scheduled to close in early 2019.
- Agricultural District Review received agricultural district inclusion requests from five landowners requesting approximately 130 acres of viable agricultural land to be added to Saratoga County Consolidated Agricultural District #2.

IDA

- Continued to provide administrative support for the operations of the Saratoga County IDA and its 7member Board
 - Processed and distributed revenues from 19 PILOT billings to Towns/Villages/City in the amount of \$44,000 on properties assessed at approximately 67 million dollars
 - Provided same for processing, collection and distribution of tax revenues for 21 projects in the amount of roughly \$596,000 for 7 school districts in which IDA projects were located.
 - Processed, billed, collected and distributed over \$11,000,000 in taxes from Global Foundries for the towns of Malta and Stillwater, Saratoga County and the Stillwater and Ballston Spa Central School Districts.
 - Closed on 4 new projects in the calendar year, representing manufacturing and commercial growth in the communities of, Northumberland, Malta, Ballston, and Halfmoon. Two Saratoga Springs projects – one in the arts and one in processing/manufacturing – closed in the last days of 2017.
- The IDA continues to provide financial support from its own revenues to enhance (through land purchase and engineering) the economic development of lands within Luther Forest.

GIS Services

- Provided up to date maps for two searches involving missing persons
- Developed new Saratoga County Map Viewer (will be launched shortly)
- Attended numerous GIS Conferences and Workshops
- Prepared materials for Census
- Assisted with trail mapping
- FEMA Region II RISC GIS Subcommittee for NY/NJ Participant
- NG911 Tri-County Support

County Fish Stocking

• Successfully completed the 2018 Saratoga County Fish Stocking assisted by numerous school districts, Boy Scout Groups, etc.

County Forestland

- Performed routine maintenance on various county farmland parcels and trails
- Completed bid on County Forestland parcel in Corinth
- Installed various signage and trail markers on County Forestland
- Reported and monitored vandalism and dumping on various parcels

Snowmobile Grant Program

- Staff to the Saratoga County Association of Snowmobile Clubs
 - 6 clubs maintain 169 miles of state funded trails
 - Provided GIS support services
- Sponsor for NYSOPRHP Snowmobile Grant-in-Aid Program
 - Submit Grant documentation and disburse funds to Saratoga County Association of snowmobile clubs.

2018 Saratoga County Employment & Training Notable Services

- Received the Veterans' Program Office Incentive Award from the NYS Department of Labor for providing priority of service to our county's veterans.
- Provided Career Center services to 2,627 walk-in customers.

- Held 12 job fairs in our building serving 92 area businesses and 308 job seekers.
- Issued 36 Metrix e-learning certificates to unemployed and underemployed residents of Saratoga County.

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- Funded 3 students for our Machine Tool Program which places students in a skilled career at completion.
- Provided funding for 10 customers to obtain their GED.
- Enrolled 97 Saratoga County youth in our Summer Youth Employment Program providing 8 weeks of paid work experience at local businesses and not for profits.
- Employed 5 youth in our Year-Round Youth Work Experience program providing 20 hours per week of paid work experience at local businesses and not for profits.

With continued sales tax growth, business expansion and retention of existing businesses-and a steadily growing tax base, Saratoga County is poised to continue with its track record of economic success. With the Board of Supervisors' continued commitment to Open Space preservation and Trail development, our residents can continue to enjoy the high quality of life that they have come to expect.

Lastly, I would like to acknowledge the hard work and dedication of the Economic Development Committee members: Supervisors Grattidge, Johnson, Lawler, Ostrander, Barrett, and Richardson. Thank you for a great year, and it has been an honor serving with you as your Chairman.

AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT WITH THE SARATOGA SPRINGS CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR THE PROVISION OF A DEPUTY SHERIFF TO SERVE AS A SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER, AND AMENDING THE 2019 BUDGET IN RELATION THERETO

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 156-2018, as amended by Resolution 167-2018, this Board authorized the execution of agreements with nine (9) school districts for the provision of one or more Saratoga County Sheriff's Department Road Patrol Deputies to serve as School Resource Officers at a cost of \$72,413.35 to be paid by each school district per assigned Deputy for the 2018-2019 school year, plus an additional \$50 per hour for overtime security services provided by each Sheriff's Department Road Patrol Deputy at school activities and events outside of normal school hours for a minimum of two (2) hours per school activity/event when requested by a school district and approved by the Sheriff; and

WHEREAS, Sheriff Zurlo has received a request from the Saratoga Springs City School District for the provision of a Saratoga County Sheriff's Department Road Patrol Deputy to serve in the capacity of a School Resource Officer at the school district for the second half of the 2018-2019 school year; and

WHEREAS, our Public Safety Committee and Sheriff Zurlo have recommended that the County enter into an agreement with Saratoga Springs City School District for the provision of a single Road Patrol Deputy to serve as School Resource Officer for the Saratoga Springs School District for that portion of the second half of the 2018-2019 school year commencing on February 1, 2019 and terminating on June 30, 2019, subject to renewal for an additional term of one year covering the 2019-2020 school year; and

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WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend the 2019 Saratoga County Budget under the Sheriff's Department to include the revenue received in 2019 from the Saratoga Springs City School District for the provision of School Resource Officer services, and to amend the corresponding expense accounts to fund necessary upfront purchases required for training, equipping and providing the School Resource Officer; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board is hereby authorized to execute an agreement with the Saratoga Springs City School District for the provision of a Saratoga County Sheriff's Department Road Patrol Deputy to serve as School Resource Officer for that portion of the second half of the 2018-2019 school year commencing on February 1, 2019 and continuing through June 30, 2019, subject to renewal for the 2019-2020 school year from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 upon the written mutual agreement of the parties, at a cost to be paid by the School District of \$36,206.67; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the contract cost for the renewal period for the 2019-2020 school year shall be \$36,206.67 for the first six months of the renewal term ending on December 31, 2019, and \$36,206.67, plus the amount of any cost-of-living increase made effective as of January 1, 2020 as may be provided for in the next Collective Bargaining Agreement to be entered into between the County and Council 82, for the second six months of the renewal term ending on June 30, 2020; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the agreement between the County and the Saratoga Springs City School District shall further provide that upon the request of the School District and the approval of the Saratoga County Sheriff's Department Road Patrol Deputies shall be authorized to provide overtime security services at school activities and events outside of normal school hours at an additional cost to the School District of \$50.00 per hour for a minimum of two (2) hours per school activity/event; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the form and content of such agreement shall be subject to the approval of the County Attorney; and be it further

WHEREAS, grant funds are available for the grant period July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2020 from the New York State Office of Indigent Legal Services in the amount of \$257,269 to assist Saratoga County and the County Public Defender's Office in implementing the Second Upstate Quality Improvement and Caseload Reduction Plan to improve the quality of indigent legal services provided by the County pursuant to County Law Article 18-B; and

WHEREAS, the County proposes to use said grant funds to continue to fund two contract Assistant Public Defender positions for indigent defense counsel assigned primarily to local town courts holding session in the evenings; and

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WHEREAS, the acceptance of this grant requires this Board's approval; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board of Supervisors is authorized to execute all necessary documents with the New York State Office of Indigent Legal Services for the acceptance of a State Office of Indigent Legal Services Grant in the amount of \$257,269 for the implementation of the Second Upstate Quality Improvement and Caseload Reduction Plan in Saratoga County for the grant period July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2020, with the form and content of such documents being subject to the approval of the County Attorney; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that in the event the State should cease to fully fund one or both of these two contract positions at any time in the future, the unfunded position or positions shall be abolished from the Saratoga County Compensation Schedule.

AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF A 2018 STATEWIDE INTEROPERABLE COMMUNICATIONS GRANT FROM THE NEW YORK STATE DIVISION OF HOMELAND SECURITY AND EMERGENCY SERVICES AND AMENDING THE 2019 COUNTY BUDGET IN RELATION THERETO

WHEREAS, the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services has awarded the County a 2018 Statewide Interoperable Communications Grant Program (2018 SICG-Formula) grant in the amount of \$812,919 for improving the interoperability and operability of emergency communications systems for the 24 month performance period from January 1, 2019 to December 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, our Director of Emergency Services proposes to utilize these grant funds to purchase communications equipment and infrastructure, and provide maintenance for the 800 MHZ radio system; and

WHEREAS, the approval of this Board and an amendment to the 2019 County Budget are needed to accept these additional SICG funds; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents required to accept from the New York State Homeland Security and Emergency Services a 2018 Statewide Interoperable Communications Grant in the amount of \$812,919 to purchase communications equipment and infrastructure, and provide maintenance for the 800 MHZ radio system; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the form and content of all said documents and agreement shall be subject to the approval of the County Attorney; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the 2019 Saratoga County Budget is amended as follows:

CORRECTING 2019 TAX BILLS AND AUTHORIZING A TAX CREDIT OR TAX REFUND AS APPLICABLE

WHEREAS, Real Property Tax Law §554 provides the procedure for the correction of errors on the tax rolls, and Real Property Tax Law §556 authorizes the provision of a credit against outstanding tax owed on a corrected tax bill or the issuance of a tax refund for a tax bill that has been paid; and

WHEREAS, Real Property Tax Law §550 (2)(d) defines a "clerical error" as an entry on a tax roll which is a mathematical error present in the computation of a tax; and

WHEREAS, the Town Supervisor for the Town of Corinth has timely submitted proof of an error in the 2019 tax bills for properties within the Passarelli Water District in the Town of Corinth, to wit: The 2019 adopted budget for the Town of Corinth mistakenly included a mathematical error in the computation of the water district levy amount for parcels within the Passerelli Water District. The Town Budget included a levy amount of \$23,179 for the Water District, which should have been in the amount of \$7,212. Due to this mathematical error in the Town Budget, said incorrect levy amount was used to calculate the water district tax rate for parcels located within the Passerelli Water District, resulting in a tax rate of 3.582148, which should have been 1.114563 under the correct levy of \$7,212; and

WHEREAS, some property owners within the Passarelli Water District have paid their 2019 property tax bills and would be entitled to a tax refund in the amount of their overpayment, while those property owners within the Passarelli Water District who have not paid their 2019 property tax bills would be entitled to receive a corrected tax bill which applies a tax credit for the amount originally overcharged for water district taxes; and

WHEREAS, our Director of Real Property Tax Services recommends that the clerical error in the 2019 tax bills of properties located within the Passarelli Water District in the Town of Corinth be corrected, and that corrected property tax bills be issued to those property owners who have not paid their 2019 tax bill, and that tax refunds be issued to each property owner who has paid their 2019 property tax bill in an amount equal to the savings determined by recalculating the tax rate for each property within the Passerelli Water District at the correct lower tax rate of 1.114563; now, therefore, be it

WHEREAS, the Program is being administered for the County by the Saratoga County Soil and Water Conservation District; and

WHEREAS, two property owners in the Town of Clifton Park submitted grant applications to the Saratoga County Soil and Water Conservation District requesting an award of Program funds for the replacement of aging septic systems on their respective properties; and

WHEREAS, the Saratoga County Soil and Water Conservation District determined that both proposed septic system projects would significantly and quantifiably reduce potential environmental and/or public health impacts that could result from these aging septic systems, and issued an award letter to both applicants notifying of their award of Program funds for the reimbursement of their eligible project costs; and

WHEREAS, both property owners have completed their septic system replacement projects, and have made application to the Saratoga County Soil and Water Conservation District for disbursement of their respective grant awards of Program funds; and

WHEREAS, the Saratoga County Soil and Water Conservation District made an application to the EFC for disbursement of the Septic System Replacement Program funds awarded for these two septic system projects, and EFC has distributed total funds in the amount of \$9,615 to the County in reimbursement of the eligible costs of said projects; and
