Meeting called to order at 3:03pm by Chairman Ropitzky.

Ropitzky announced the passing of Vice Chairman Don Monica, he passed on February 9th, 2021. Don was a member of the Soil & Water District for over 25 years and a good friend. He will be greatly missed.

- 1. <u>Minutes of January 2021 Meeting:</u> Motion to approve by Grasso, seconded by Matthews, carried unanimously.
- 2. January 2021 Financial Reports:
 - a. Receipts/Disbursements Report, Budget vs Actual Report and Vouchers: (Attachment A, B & C) Motion to approve made by Grasso, seconded by Koval, carried unanimously.
- 3. Field Report:
- 4. Cooperating Agency Reports:
 - a. NRCS: No report.
 - b. FSA: Reported distributed to all by email.
 - c. RC&D: No report.
 - d. **NYSSWCC:** Monthly reported distributed to all by email.
 - e. NYACD: No report.
 - f. CCE: Lewis reported CCE looking for drone footage to assist with video lessons they will be offering. Lewis also reported that the Prism MOU is still being worked on due to insurance issues.

5. Old Business:

- a. Water Quality Coordinating Committee: A meeting was held last week; reports have come in from Ballston Lake and Lewis will be working with Blue on Sweet Rd Creek sub watershed plan. Friend of the Kaydeross annual meeting will be held on 03/15/2021 on zoom. Saratoga Lake talking about the new PDD in Malta. Connelly reported that they are getting another harvester & dumpster for Saratoga Lake. A motion to reimburse Dave Pierce \$30 for training he attended was made by Matthews, seconded by Garlanda, carried unanimously.
- b. **Grants:** Lewis reported on the following:
 - Agricultural Environmental Management McCarthy & Palemire completed interim report & submitted for reimbursement of 2020 time. This winter the District will need to decide on type of projects for next contract (2022 – 20203).
 - ii. CAFO Grants Received final approval for Koval grant, will be sending back \$123,000 to the State as Koval's also received funding from NRCS on the project. The District earned just under \$8,000 on the project and \$12,225 is owed to Koval for engineering costs. A **motion** was made to approve issuing final payments for the Koval grant by Grasso, seconded by Matthews, Koval recused, all others approved the motion, motion carried. The paperwork for the Welcomestock grant is being completed & expected to be submitted later this month.
 - iii. Septic System Lewis received a call from Phil Barrett of Clifton Park, who was looking for report on how the grant process works, he also asked about funding a project in Rexford, which would not be eligible for this grant. Lewis sent out feelers out to DEC to see if any additional grants were expected or any guidelines of this grant were changing so that the Rexford project could possibly qualify but has not heard back. Grasso expressed a concern about cherry picking projects, wants to make sure any grants the District is considering is viewed from a County perspective.

- iv. Roadside Erosion Payments that were approved at the January meeting have been issued. No work can be done until Spring as the District will be doing hydroseeding.
- v. Resiliency Training Tentative dates have been scheduled, working with Upper Hudson & Lake Champlain watershed Counties. Hoping to hold 2-3 trainings in the Spring & 2-3 trainings in the Fall.
- **c.** T&S 2021: McCarthy reported that we have received almost 80 orders through the new shop. So far all the feedback about the online shop have been positive.
- **d.** Envirothon 2021: Lewis & McCarthy attended a webinar on how to set up a virtual Envirothon. Fulton County is still onboard, Washington County has backed out. The virtual Envirothon will be held on Wednesday, May 5th, will not need volunteers this year as the students will not be required to put together an oral presentation.
- e. <u>Audit of 2020 Books:</u> McCarthy reminded the Board that an audit of the 2020 books will need to be done once in person meetings can be held.

6. New Business:

- a. <u>Approval for Billboard signs:</u> A motion was made to spend up to \$1500 on new billboard signs was made by Grasso, seconded by Koval, carried unanimously.
- b. <u>Building:</u> Lewis reported that he is working with Chad Cook, who is now working at Building & Grounds about the air quality issues in the office. Cook has toured the office & mentioned that the duct works look great and he is wondering if the carpeting is causing issues.
- c. <u>Vice Chair Replacement:</u> Lewis will contact Grange for possible new Board member, if they are unable to provide someone, the District can bring on an At Large member. The Board decided to hold off electing a new Vice Chair until a new Board member can be obtained.
- d. <u>Memorial for Don Monica:</u> Ideas were brought up for a memorial for Don Monica, who was a Board member for over 25 years. The Board decided on ordering a plaque that could be hung at the Sugar House in his honor.
- 7. <u>Next Meeting Date and Adjournment</u>: The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, March 17, 2021 at 3:00pm. Meeting adjourned by Chairman at 4:07pm.
