Meeting called to order at 3:03pm by Chairman Ropitzky.

- 1. Minutes of April 2021 Meeting: Motion to approve by Grasso, seconded by O'Connor, carried unanimously.
- 2. April 2021 Financial Reports:
 - a. Receipts/Disbursements Report, Budget vs Actual Report and Vouchers: (Attachment A, B & C)
 Motion to approve made by O'Connor, seconded by Grasso, carried unanimously.
- 3. Field Report: (Attachment D)
- 4. Cooperating Agency Reports:
 - a. **NRCS:** Lewis reported that he received an email that NRCS has an updated policy allowing fully vaccinated do not need masks or social distance, he will forward it to the Board.
 - b. **RC&D:** No report.
 - c. NYSSWCC: Report distributed by email.
 - d. **NYACD:** No report. Received a note in the mail that NYACD is currently looking for Area Representatives & a new Treasurer.
 - e. **CCE**: District staff assisted at the fairgrounds getting the Conservation Building ready. Sundae on the Farm will be held on Father's Day at Mill Creek Farm with a no contact drive through tour. Plans for summer drive in movie night at Malta Drive-In.

5. Old Business:

- a. Water Quality Coordinating Committee: No meeting this month.
- b. **Grants:** Lewis reported on the following:
 - i. Agricultural Environmental Management Palemire been getting ready for next round, changes coming to rules/regs next year. Lewis will update once they are released to Districts.
 - ii. CAFO No current activity. McCarthy advised the check sent to the State for unused funds for the Koval grant was cashed & should be closed out later this month.
 - iii. Septic Troy from Planning Department is putting together list of owner names & addresses for next round of letters
 - iv. Roadside Erosion Lewis & Palemire will GPS the hydroseeding sites in Edinburgh on Friday, will add the site to the hydroseeding schedule
 - v. Resiliency Training 1 training has been held, next is scheduled for June 14th at 4H Building in Ballston Spa, others are being planned by other Districts. Lewis will be sending info out to Towns & Board of Supervisors.
- **c.** T&S 2021: Lots of positive feedback was given, will be keeping the drive through & online store, will have handouts for DEC Tree Nursery. No big changes for 2022.
- **d.** Envirothon 2021: McCarthy reported that a virtual Envirothon was held on May 5th with 6 teams participating. The kids and teachers sent lots of positive feedback, everyone is hoping to be able to hold it in person for 2022. The Saratoga County and Overall winner is the Ballston Spa Envirodorks who will be competing in the NYS competition.
- e. <u>Tire Recycling:</u> To date only 147 tires have been registered, usually have about 400 by now. Due to low participation, Lewis decided to cancel the large trailer as it was a \$2600 fee. Instead the Staff will use the trucks & billboard trailer to collect what we can & then deliver them to Casings in Catskill. Another Tire Recycling will be held in the Fall & will also include Ag tires.
- f. <u>Compensation Study Request:</u> Lewis met with County HR, they suggested staff create new duty statements, which were handed in yesterday. HR will use the statements to determine comparable County positions to assist in calculating suggested pay rates.
- g. Fish Stocking 2021: Vendor waited until 3 days before deadline to advise they will not be delivering fish to us this year. After multiple discussion, a compromise was made that the vendor will deliver our order of Grass Carp to Albany County tomorrow & staff will pick up form there to deliver to our customers. All other orders had to canceled & refunded. This is the 2nd year this vendor has canceled out on us, staff will look into other vendors or other ways to hold the Program for 2022.

6. New Business:

- a. **SLIPID Event:** District will attend an event on June 13th at Brown's Beach, this is an event on the beach to answer questions & do demos, our stream table will be there for demos.
- b. Carpet/Air Testing: The carpet has been reinstalled & the office back together, still some boxes to unpack. Unfortunately, McCarthy is still experiencing adverse effects after being in the office. Lewis emailed Chad Cook & obtained permission for the District to contract a company to do an Air Quality Test. The District would be required to contract & pay for any testing. Quoted \$470 from local company for the testing. Garlanda asked if the company who gave a quote was certified & if the County would accept the test results. Lewis answered that the company is certified with a certified lab, Lewis has not received an answer to if the County would accept the results. Koval asked if the test was just for mold? Lewis responded that both mold & other things that come up on the slide will be tested. The District can also opt for additional testing on pollen, fibers, synthetic particles (does not include chemical testing) for an additional \$150.00. O'Connor advised that County's physician should be consulted to assist in determining which tests would be appropriate. A motion was made to approve spending up to \$1000 on Air Quality Testing by O'Connor, seconded by Koval, carried unanimously.
- c. Knights Orchard: The District has received a request from Knight's Orchard to have District hydroseed for them after completing a farm project. Lewis explained that the District has never done private hydroseeding, if the Board were to approve, he suggested a \$350 per load fee which would include materials plus 2 employees for 2 hours. This is strictly for farm stabilization projects as the District does not want to compete with private companies for hydroseeding. Garlanda asked if the District would need any additional insurance to be able to fulfill request. Lewis advised that the District's current insurance policy would cover staff for any liability issues. Grasso stated he felt that the Board should be consulted on all requests & give approval per case. Ropitzky asked how much one load covers, Lewis responded that 1 load covers about ¼ acre of land, Monica stated that the farm is looking for 1 1.5 acres, so possibility of 6 loads. A motion was made by Grasso, seconded by Garlanda to set a rate of \$350 per hydroseeding load for Knight's farm project, carried unanimously.
- d. NRCS Lease: Lease is up in September, Lewis had been told it is currently in the works to renew, will keep the Board updated.

7. Other Business:

- a. <u>NYALGRO Conference</u>: McCarthy advised that NYALGRO is holding their annual conference, Lewis & McCarthy would both like to attend, cost will be \$160.00.
