Economic Development Committee Minutes May 5, 2022 – 3:30 p.m.

Present: Chairman Kevin Tollisen; Committee Members Joe Grasso, Mark Hammond, Jonathan Schopf, Kevin Veitch, Matt Veitch, and Tom Wood; Supervisors Phil Barrett, Bill Peck; Steve Bulger, Ridge Harris, Matt Rose, Christine Rush, County Administrator; Michael Hartnett, County Attorney; Andrew Jarosh, Treasurer; Jenniffer McCloskey, Employment & Training; Jason Kemper, Planning & Economic Development; Pete Bardunias, Capital Region Chamber.

Chairman Tollisen called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

On a motion made by Mr. Wood, seconded by Mr. Hammond, the minutes of the April 7, 2022 meeting were approved unanimously.

A motion was made by Mr. Grasso, seconded by Mr. Hammond, to authorize an agreement with the Capital Region Chamber of Commerce. Unanimous.

Mr. Bulger said that funding in the amount of \$60,000 was included in the 2022 budget for this agreement and Community Development Plan. Mr. Bardunias gave an overview of the plan which was distributed with the agenda. A copy of the Community Development Program update is attached to these minutes.

Supervisor Barrett gave a brief update to the committee regarding the Saratoga County Prosperity Partnership. At a recent SCPP Board meeting, the consensus of the board was that in light of the fact that operations are being slowed down, they will not request funding from the County for the remainder of the year. This will leave approximately \$350K of tourism and economic development funds available for other uses. Mr. Barrett proposed possibly doubling the current allocation of funding to municipalities for the Economic Development and Community Planning Fund. This has been a successful program since it began in 2019. Another proposal would be to invest in the planning of the upcoming 250th Anniversary of the Battle of Saratoga. The 250th Commission are actively planning the celebration and if prepared correctly, having events and infrastructure in place, this celebration will benefit the entire County's economy. Mr. Barrett suggested offering \$100K of seed money as a start towards the planning efforts.

Mr. Veitch said that the occupancy tax law would need to be amended I order to back the funding out of the Partnership. Mr. Hartnett said that he can draft a proposed Home Rule legislation request to amend the occupancy tax law for the Committee's consideration. Currently under the contract with the Partnership, any unspent funds would come back to the County anyway, as long as they are utilized for the same intended purpose. Mr. Hartnett said that he believes both of Supervisor Barrett's proposals fit within the purpose.

A motion was made by Mr. Grasso, seconded by Mr. Schopf, to authorize additional appropriations for the Municipal Economic Development Grant Program and the Saratoga County 250th American Revolution project. Unanimous.

Mr. Tollisen said that the approximate \$7K in funding that is currently provided to each municipality has been very popular and widely used. Doubling this to approximately \$14K per municipality will go even further. The anniversary of a turning point in our Nation's History is an important event to recognize. Mr. Wood said that he is a member of the 250th Commission and believes the proposed allocation would be an excellent use of the funds.

Mr. Bulger said that the Planning & Economic Development office will be taking over the management of the Economic Development Municipal grants. If the increase in funding allocation to these grants is approved, Mr. Kemper's office will be reaching out to Supervisors to get the ball rolling on that project.

Mr. Hammond suggested that information regarding the 250th Commission be sent to Mr. Bardunias for the Exit 9 Visitor Center.

A motion was made by Mr. Grasso, seconded by Mr. Matt Veitch, the meeting was adjourned unanimously.

The info center at the Exit 9 Rest Area places Saratoga County information in front of 200,000-250,000 people each year. Traffic remains very high at that location, this county's only dedicated connection to the I-87 corridor.



Why Review? Farms and marine businesses are facing challenges from within their communities, from state tax laws, generational problems, and more. Farmers on tractors are often in dangerous situations due to aggressive drivers. Efforts to dramatically alter the Canal System would dramatically impact area businesses. Truck strikes on bridges have done considerable damage in some instances.

•Following up on the March DOT event, the CSSC is hosting a farm tractor exhibit at the Waterford Canal Festival with information demonstrating the need to respect farm tractors on roads, and explaining proper etiquette. An article in the 2Q Saratoga Business Report printed version will also discuss this important topic.

•Canal advocacy – efforts by some groups to sever the Erie and Champlain Canals will have direct impact on water tourism and commercial marine transport to Saratoga County. Also Canal issues have thwarted attempts to make progress on Area 3

•Waterford Canal Festival to feature a seminar on avoiding the use of Round Gobies as bait.
