# Saratoga County Veterans Service Agency

### **Mission Statement**

"The Saratoga County Veterans Service Agency assists Veterans and their families with securing earned benefits and services through quality customer service and advocacy."

Saratoga County is home approximately **15,343 Veterans** and their families. The Agency is staffed by Accredited Service Officers to assist in filing claims for Federal VA benefits which include:

- Disability Compensation
- Pension / Aid & Attendance
- Health Care
- Education and Training

- Home Loan
- Burial and Memorial
- Dependents and Survivors

Agency staff also provides additional services to include:

- Transition Assistance
- Homeless Outreach Housing Assistance
- Military Records and Medals Requests
- Inter-County and Outside agency connections and referrals
- Employment connections and referrals to resources
- Van Transportation to Stratton VA Medical Center, Albany
- Support of Veteran Recognition Programs and Ceremonies
- Outreach Presentations and Education
- Veterans resource for local governments

Saratoga County has honored over 300 Veterans at the monthly Honor Deceased Veterans Ceremony. The ceremony has become a tradition here at Saratoga County, and includes participation from elected officials at all levels of government, as well as local Veterans organizations and supporters.

The Saratoga County F.A.V.O.R. Program is dedicated to educating and assisting Veterans record in the importance of recording their original DD-214 discharge document with the County Clerk's office. By doing so, Veterans and their families are readily equipped to garnish a variety of benefits and programs available to them in honor of their service to our Country.

The Saratoga County Veterans Trust Fund accepts donations and makes disbursements to Saratoga County Veterans and Veteran's organizations in need of assistance. The Fund provides grants to Saratoga County Veterans or their families for training, education, health care, housing assistance and essential services; and for the benefit of groups, organizations, programs, and projects dedicated to the welfare and support of the Saratoga County Veterans. Donations are tax deductible, and all funds stay local.

The Saratoga County Veterans Peer Connection provides an opportunity for local Veterans who have reintegrated to civilian life to assist fellow Veterans who may experience post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) or other reacclimation challenges. Personalized and informal, these pairings yield relationships intended to ease the transition from military to civilian life. Funding is made possible through the PFC Joseph P. # VSA 2022 by the Numbers:

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- Veteran Population According to VA VetPop figures from FY2020, Saratoga County is home to 15,343 veterans, ranking 14<sup>th</sup> in NYS. For comparison; Albany County -15,261 Rensselaer County –10,049; Warren 4,416; Washington County 4,312; Schenectady County 8,244. <a href="https://www.va.gov/vetdata/veteran\_population.asp">https://www.va.gov/vetdata/veteran\_population.asp</a>
- Veterans Transportation The Saratoga County VSA provided 209 Veterans rides to VA medical appointments, logging over 9817miles between January and December 2022. This number is down significantly due to COVID19. (Appendix A)
- VA Expenditures Department of Veterans Affairs Total Expenditures for FY 2021 equaled \$102,525,000 in Saratoga County. See attached for breakdown. (Appendix B)
- Peer to Peer Program Saratoga County Veterans Peer to Peer Mentoring Program
  continued to expand and currently has 141 active Peers involved. While this number is
  down from last year, this is an accurate representation of individuals who are involved
  and engaged in the program. Our new Program Coordinator has made a big effort in the
  last 2 months of contacting all Veterans involved, past and present, to determine status.
  The decrease in participants accounts for those who have moved away, moved on in
  life, or have not responded to contact.
- electronic Claim Development 100% of all claims that pass through this office are electronically developed and archived. This allows for an integrated service network internally, and more efficient service and record keeping. We also submit all claims electronically, with few exceptions due to extremely large medical files, etc. that exceed our ability to submit electronically. In April 2020, we upgraded our contact/case management software system to the "VetPro" platform. This platform allows for fully web-based access, along with remote signature capabilities, and fully electronic submission direct to the VA's VBMS system. We also maintain electronic access and partnership with NYS Division of Veterans Services and utilize their "VetOps" system. We maintain access to VA Information Systems, which allows us to seek information regarding clients claims, payments, dependents, etc.
- Veterans ID Card (FAVOR) The VSA continues to partner with, and assist the Saratoga County Clerk and Saratoga County Board of Supervisors with the FAVOR Veterans ID card program. This program has also contributed to the VSA conducting over 61 official requests for records in 2022 and over 2300 since the beginning of the program for those Veterans who did not have proper service documentation in their possession. These requests will facilitate future benefits delivery for either financial and/or end of life benefits for Veterans and their surviving family members.

### VSA 2022 Highlights:

- Staff Training The Staff of the Saratoga County VSA participates in ongoing professional development and training to ensure constant adherence to VA laws and regulations. In 2022, this included:
  - Quarterly Veteran Service Officer Conference (Zoom/Teams)
  - VA Information Security Awareness Privacy Policy Training (e-learn)
  - NYS Division of Veterans Affairs Training (web-based monthly trainings offered in 2022)
  - National Association of County Veterans Service Officers Web -based and in person
    - Director McClement attended annual training conference in San Antonio. TX.
- Honor Deceased Veteran Ceremonies The Program returned to a consistent schedule in 2022. This program continues to be a success, and working in partnership with the Board of Supervisors, as well as county, state, and congressional elected officials, and local Veterans organizations we have been able to tell some great stories and highlight the military service and lives of some of Saratoga County's best. Appendix E
- Veterans Transportation Service Service use continued to be down significantly from pre-Covid numbers due to many programs closed at the VAMC due to COVID restrictions still in place. Van ridership did begin to slightly increase as more services were restored at the VA, and with a full cadre of drivers we were glad to be able to return to our normal schedule of 4 days a week. Our current van has now been in service since April 2015. and currently has 145,738 miles on the odometer. In 2021, we received a surprise bequest in the Last Will of a former Veteran rider who had recently passed away. As a thank you for our service provided to him and other Veterans, he left the Agency \$20,000 toward the purchase of a new bus. Additional funds were approved in the 2022 Budget, but we have experienced difficulty in ordering a replacement due to supply chain issues. We expect to be able to place an order in 2023. In the interim, DPW mechanics went through and serviced and spruced up our vehicle, and we also took possession of the 12-passenger van from the BOS. We will be able to provide service for our riders until a new vehicle is procured. Appendix A
- Saratoga County P2P Veterans Program 2022 was a bit of a challenging year for our program. Though we experienced staff changeover, and some difficulty in participation due to the aftermath of the pandemic, the Peer to Peer Program pushed forward during 2022. We were able to renew some of our programming, especially our popular drop-in Coffee Night. We also closed the year strong with a well-attended Christmas Party, which was our biggest yet! NYS funding for the program was also granted as permanent, alleviating much of the uncertainty and pressure experienced in previous years.


- Facebook The Saratoga County Veterans Facebook page allows us to reach out to individuals and groups with up to date information. This has proven to be a valuable, non-traditional, and no-cost tool to use for outreach. We have utilized this platform to also promote our events, especially the Run for Veterans. The page currently has 1,041 followers, with over 75,000 friends of fans, which is the total potential population that can be reached with a post. <a href="www.facebook.com/SaratogaCountyVeterans">www.facebook.com/SaratogaCountyVeterans</a>
- Electronic Claim Development No major changes in 2022. We continue to maximize
  efforts to be as "paperless" as possible. While we had been exploring new and
  improved options for case/contact management software, the pandemic created a
  sense of urgency for the upgrade. In April 2020, we upgraded our contact/case
  management software system to the "VetPro" platform. This platform allows for fully
  web-based access, along with remote signature capabilities, and fully electronic
  submission directly to the VA VBMS system. The software platform continues to grow
  and improve as has our experience and knowledge working with it. We hope to
  continue to make daily operational changes to maximize its use and capability as the
  software allows.
- Equipment We continue to upgrade equipment as recommended by IT. We also continue to utilize our software platform, VetPro, which allows us to work remotely if necessary in emergency situations.
- Veterans Outreach— We were happy to be able to participate in some in-person outreach events in 2022. Notably, staff attended the Saratoga County Fair, Farmers Markets, as well as speaking at Veterans breakfasts and luncheons. We also continue to rely on word of mouth referrals due to maintaining close liaison with outside agencies and organizations that interact with Veterans, as well as leveraging social media.
- Affiliate Organizations Agency Director and staff are either members or maintain close liaison with over 20 outside groups and organizations. - Appendix F
- Veterans Trust and Agency Fund Our fund continues to remain healthy. In 2022, the BOS Veterans Committee voted a grant program for local Veteran posts efforts to adopt and support local families during the Christmas holiday season. Funds were also leveraged to purchase gift cards for needy Veteran families for Christmas, as well as assist with prizes for our Annual Veterans Christmas Party. Appendix D
- Revolutionary Run for Veterans We were excited to able to plan and execute a successful event in 2022 after a 2-year hiatus. Even though sponsorships were a little down from previous years, we were able to build awareness for our programs and raise over \$5000 for the Veterans Trust Fund.

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BOS Veterans Grant Program – Board Resolution 107-2021 directed the creation of a
Grant Program Honoring Saratoga County Veterans. Funding for this program was
provided for in the Veterans Agency budget, and local municipalities submitted
reimbursement requests to the VSA for processing. An amendment to this resolution
provided that any unused funds be transferred to the Veterans Trust Fund at the end of
2021. This program was not renewed for 2022, however, 1 municipality was able to
submit for a grant through the funds transferred to the Trust Fund as their event and
efforts were stalled in 2021 due to COVID.

### **Major Legislation Highlights**

- NYS Budget PFC Joseph Dwyer Grant Program Funding for the PFC Joseph Dwyer
  Peer program has been made permanent and has been rolled out statewide in the 20222023 NYS Budget. This will alleviate significant amount of uncertainty regarding the
  program and allow Director McClement and the Program Coordinator to focus on
  program improvements and expansion.
  - Pact ACT Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring Our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics (PACT) Act of 2022. Signed into law in October 2022, this legislation is arguably the largest piece of federal Veterans legislation in the last 10-20 years. The PACT Act expands VA health care and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic substances including Camp Lejeune water. Due to the high -profile nature of the law, phone calls and inquiries about this law and associated benefits have significantly increased since it's passing. The law affects generations of Veterans and families, and will have an impact for years to come. Along with that comes the additional need for training as well as the possibility for additional staff to address the needs of more Veterans than ever before.
- Commitment to Veteran Support and Outreach Act The CVSO Act would provide
   critical federal resources to help us meet our growing caseloads by awarding
   competitive grants worth \$250 million over five years for states to create, expand, or
   support CVSOs or similar government entities, such as state, municipal and tribal VSOs.
   This has not been signed into law as of yet, but we look forward to opportunities for
   federal funding for our programs and efforts.



# Conclusion

Overall, 2022 was a successful year for our Agency. We strived to serve as many clients as possible, and continued to also focus on those most in need. In 2022, we were able to continue to move in the right direction of getting back to pre-pandemic activity, and we hope 2023 will be a tremendous year for our efforts to serve.
