## **RESOLUTION 16 - 2023**

Introduced by Law and Finance: Supervisors Schopf, Barrett, Edwards, Grasso, Lant, Tollisen and M. Veitch

AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE 2022 AGREEMENT WITH NATIONAL MEDICAL SERVICES, INC. D/B/A NMS LABS TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL POSTMORTEM TOXICOLOGICAL SERVICES

WHEREAS, in connection with their duties in determining causes of death of persons dying within the County of Saratoga, our County Coroners require the toxicological services of qualified medical laboratories; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, there has been a significant increase in mortality in Saratoga County; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 326-2021, this Board of Supervisors authorized a renewal of the agreement with National Medical Services, Inc. d/b/a NMS Labs ("NMS Labs"), to provide post-mortem toxicological services to the County Coroners for the term January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022, with a total contract cost not to exceed \$75,000; and

WHEREAS, the services rendered by NMS Labs to the County Coroners pursuant to said agreement in 2022 exceeded the authorized contract amount of \$75,000; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend Resolution 326-2021 to increase the contract limit with NMS Labs for laboratory services provided in 2022 from \$75,000 to \$110,000 in order to pay for the increase in costs, and to authorize an amendment to the 2022 contract with NMS Labs; and

WHEREAS, our Law and Finance Committee and the County Coroners have recommended that the contract for post-mortem toxicology services with NMS Labs for the term January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 be amended to increase the authorized contract amount by \$35,000 for a total contract amount of \$110,000 for 2022; now, therefore it is

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board of Supervisors is authorized to execute an amended agreement with National Medical Services, Inc. d/b/a NMS Labs to provide post-mortem toxicological services for the Saratoga County Coroners' Office for a term of one year commencing on January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 at NMS Labs' prevailing 2022 Fee Schedule rates charged for routine Postmortem Toxicology panels, as same may be amended from time to time, and at its prevailing 2022 rates for special pricing panels as listed in its Pricing Summary for Toxicology Laboratory Services, as same may be amended from time to time, provided each such test has been ordered by the Coroner's Physician or his assistant, with total contract costs not to exceed \$110,000; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that Resolution 326-2021 is hereby amended accordingly, and it is further

RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

## **RESOLUTION 17 - 2023**

AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE 2022 AGREEMENT WITH SARATOGA HOSPITAL TO PROVIDE FOR ADDITIONAL USE OF LABORATORY AND MORGUE **FACILITIES** 

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 180-2019, as amended by Resolution 30-2022, this Board authorized an agreement with Saratoga Hospital to provide for the use of the Hospital's morgue and laboratory facilities and services by our County Coroners when performing autopsies and other postmortem activities, for a three year term commencing on January 1, 2020 and terminating on December 31, 2022 at the rates set forth in Saratoga Hospital's published fee schedules for each of the years 2020, 2021 and 2022, with the annual cost not to exceed \$65,000 for the years 2021 and 2022; and

WHEREAS, due to increasing numbers of cases handled by the County Coroners at Saratoga Hospital in 2022, it is necessary to amend the agreement to increase the contract limit from \$65,000 to \$75,000 for the year 2022; and

WHEREAS, our Law and Finance Committee and the County Coroners have recommended that the contract with Saratoga Hospital be amended to increase the contract limit from \$65,000 to \$75,000 for the year 2022; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board is authorized to execute an amended agreement with Saratoga Hospital of Saratoga Springs, New York, to provide morgue and laboratory facilities and services for the Saratoga County Coroners' Office for the year 2022 at the rates set forth in Saratoga Hospital's published fee schedules for the year 2022, with the total cost not to exceed \$75,000; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the form and content of such amended agreement shall be subject to the approval of the County Attorney; and it is further

RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

RESOLVED, that the County Auditor is authorized pursuant to §554 of the Real Property Tax Law to approve corrections of errors on tax rolls in amounts not to exceed \$2,500, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the County Auditor is authorized pursuant to §556(8) of the Real Property Tax Law to approve tax credits in amounts not to exceed \$2,500, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the County Auditor shall report to the Real Property Tax Committee all refunds, corrections and credits made pursuant to the authority delegated by this Resolution; and it is further

RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Transportation proposes a Pavement Corrective Maintenance 23B project for Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1 ("SCSD No. 1"), including part of Route 67 in the Town of Stillwater, PIN 1811.44; and

WHEREAS, the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors approves of such project and the State of New York will include as part of the construction of the above mentioned project, height adjustment of existing sanitary sewer manholes as needed, pursuant to Article II, Section 10, Subdivision 24 of the State Highway Law, as shown on the contract plans relating to the project and meeting the requirements of SCSD No. 1; and

WHEREAS, SCSD No. 1 maintains sewer facilities on Route 67 within the project limits; and

WHEREAS, the service life of the adjusted utilities has not been extended; and

WHEREAS, the State will provide for the reconstruction of the above-mentioned work, as shown on the contract plans relating to the above-mentioned project and at no cost to the County; now, therefore it is

RESOLVED, the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors grants permission to the State of New York to complete the above-mentioned work performed on the above-mentioned project and that the County will continue to maintain or cause to be maintained, at its own expense, the adjusted facilities performed by the State as shown on the contract plans; and it is further

RESOLVED, the Chair of the Board, Theodore T. Kusnierz, Jr., is authorized to sign, with the concurrence of the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors and the County Attorney, any and all documents that may become necessary as a result of this project; and it is further

AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF NEW YORK STATE HEALTHCARE WORKER BONUS PROGRAM FUNDS, DISBURSEMENT OF PROGRAM FUNDS TO ELIGIBLE SARATOGA COUNTY EMPLOYEES, AND AMENDING THE 2023 COUNTY BUDGET IN **RELATION THERETO** 

WHEREAS, as part of the 2022 -2023 enacted New York State Budget, the State Legislature allocated \$1.2 billion in funding to the New York State Health Care Worker Bonus ("HWB") program for the payment of bonuses for certain frontline health care workers; and

WHEREAS, the HWB provision allows for the payment of bonuses to "recruit, retain, and reward health care and mental hygiene workers" meeting certain eligibility requirements as determined and approved by New York State; and

WHEREAS, the HWB program requires distribution of funds within 30 days of receipt of those funds thereby requiring the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors to approve receipt of those funds at the January 2023 board meeting; and

WHEREAS, the HWB program has determined an amount of \$273,431; and

WHEREAS, the Law and Finance Committee and the Director of Human Resources have recommended the acceptance of these funds; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board is authorized to execute all documents and agreements necessary to accept the New York State Health Care Worker Bonus program funds in the final amount as determined by New York State, with the form and content of such documents and agreements to be subject to the approval of the County Attorney; and it is further

## **RESOLUTION 22 - 2023**

Introduced by Law and Finance: Supervisors Schopf, Barrett, Edwards, Grasso, Lant, Tollisen and M. Veitch

AUTHORIZING A SETTLEMENT WITH TEVA PHARMACEUTICAL INDUSTRIES, LTD. AND TEVA PHARMACEUTICALS USA, INC. (COLLECTIVELY TEVA) NAMED IN AN ACTION TO RECOVER DAMAGES IN COMBATTING AND TREATING OPIOID ABUSE

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 203-2017, this Board authorized the commencement of litigation against the manufacturers, distributors, and certain prescribing physicians of opioid pharmaceuticals to recover damages resulting from the County combatting and treating opioid abuse, and further authorized the retention of Napoli Shkolnik, PLLC to serve as special counsel with respect to the initiation and prosecution of such litigation; and

WHEREAS, the County of Saratoga and many other municipalities are a member of a lawsuit commenced in Suffolk County against manufacturers, distributors, and certain prescribing physicians of opioid pharmaceuticals; and

WHEREAS, an action was commenced against defendants Teva Pharmaceutical Industries, Ltd., and all of its respective past and present direct or indirect parents, subsidiaries, division affiliates, joint ventures, predecessors, successors, assigns including but not limited to Teva Pharmaceuticals USA, Inc., the Actavis Generic Entities, and Adna, (collectively "Teva"), based on claims that Teva contributed to the opioid epidemic by falsely promoting prescription opioids it manufactured and sold and by falsely promoting the increased use of opioids directly and through various 'front groups' and failing to implement measures to prevent diversion of prescription opioids in connection with distribution of its product, all of which contributed to a public health crisis; and

WHEREAS, Teva will pay up to \$550 million dollars depending on the level of participation in New York State, and specific amounts to be paid to 'direct share subdivisions' will be subject to various scenarios; and

WHEREAS, the cornerstone of the proposed settlement is a full resolution of all governmental claims filed in the State against Teva which will maximize the recovery and incentive scenarios which are built into the agreement to secure and achieve a full \$550 million value of the settlement; and

WHEREAS, to join the proposed settlement, this Board needs to authorize the County becoming a party to the Teva Settlement Term Sheet and the New York Opioid Settlement Sharing Agreement and become a "direct share subdivision"; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the proposed settlement, all counsel fees, costs and expenses will be paid directly by Teva from a separate fund; and

WHEREAS, Napoli Shkolnik, PLLC and the County Attorney have recommended settlement of the lawsuit against Teva as recommended to avoid protracted litigation and to maximize the recovery of damages for the County; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that it is in the best interests of the County to resolve and settle the litigation against Teva in the manner proposed by Napoli Shkolnik, PLLC, and this Board authorizes settlement of all claims and demands made by the County of Saratoga against Teva Pharmaceutical Industries, Ltd. and Teva Pharmaceuticals, USA (collectively "TEVA") in the manner proposed by Napoli Shkolnik, PLLC; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board and/or special counsel Napoli Shkolnik, PLLC, and/or the County Attorney are hereby authorized to execute the Teva New York Sharing Agreement and the New York Teva Term Sheet and any other releases or documents necessary to settle and conclude the litigation commenced by the County of Saratoga against Teva; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the form and content of such documents and releases shall be subject to the approval of the County Attorney; and it is further

RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.
