General Controls is our sole provider of SCADA services at SCSD #1 as they have an intimate knowledge of the hardware and software. We have purchased software that allows us to report permitted values from our instrumentation to our month discharge monitoring report. The existing software was housed on a old server that has reached its end of life, and we need to replace the server. IT stated the best course would be to purchase the server through our SCADA vendor as they are aware of the requirements, set up, troubleshooting etc. This cost covers the server costs, time to configure the server and the software, as well as some additional time for potential SCADA issues that occur in 2023.

WHEREAS, as a result of increasing maintenance needs for the SCADA system this year, including unplanned repair and main time, services rendered by GCSI have exceeded the threshold for a minor contract; and

WHEREAS, the Saratoga County Sewer District Commission and the Executive Director of the Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1 have recommended that the County enter into an agreement with General Control Systems, Inc. for professional services, equipment and hardware to repair and update Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1's instrumentation systems, including its SCADA system, and ancillary equipment, for the term January 1, 2021 pugh December 31, 2021 at a cost not to exceed \$30,000; now, therefore, be it

This Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into this _____ day of _____ 2023 by and between Saratoga County, a municipal corporation existing by and under the laws of the State of New York, acting for Saratoga County Sewer District No.1, and having its principal place of business located at 40 Mc Master Street, Ballston Spa, New York 12020, (hereinafter referred to as the "County"), and the Town of Moreau, a municipal corporation existing by and under the laws of the State of New York, acting for Town of Moreau Sewer District 1, Extension 5, and having its principal place of business located at 351 Reynolds Road, Moreau, New York 12828, (hereinafter referred to as the "Town"), (collectively referred to herein as the "Parties").

WHEREAS, on April 6, 2021, the Town and County entered into an Agreement to construct a sanitary sewer forcemain (hereinafter referred to as the "County Forcemain Connection"), which will connect the Town to the Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1 (hereinafter referred to as "SCSD") collection and treatment system, and such April 6, 2021 Agreement remains in effect until construction of the County Forcemain Connection is complete; and

WHEREAS, the Parties are currently constructing the County Forcemain Connection with a scheduled completion date of December 15, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into an Agreement setting forth the terms, as hereinafter described, and each Party's responsibilities in conjunction therewith; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Moreau is entirely located within the boundaries of Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and pursuant to the authority vested in the County and the Town by the General Municipal Law, the Town Law, and other statutes of the State of New York, and in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, the Parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 – PURPOSE

1. The purpose is to define long-term billing, operation, and maintenance items associated with the County Forcemain Connection.

ARTICLE 2 – TERM

1. This Agreement shall become effective on such date that the Agreement is fully executed by both parties.

ARTICLE 3 – TOWN RESPONSIBILITIES

1. The Town agrees to construct the County Forcemain Connection from Station 228+55 to Station 503+10 as shown on the construction specifications and plans titled "District 1,

County Forcemain Connection Intermunicipal Agreement Page 2 of 4

- Extension 5 County Forcemain Connection," prepared by Laberge Group, dated November 2022, last revised January 2023 (hereinafter referred to as the "Plans").
- 2. Once construction is completed, the Town agrees that the SCSD will be responsible for the operation and maintenance of the portion to be constructed by the Town.
- 3. The Town agrees to convey ownership and notify the SCSD in writing when all debts and liens associated with constructing the Town portion of the County Forcemain Connection are satisfied.
- 4. The SCSD will bill the Town for trunking and treatment of sewerage, and the Town will be responsible for billing the Town of Moreau sewer customers.
- 5. The Town agrees to pay SCSD based on the published scale of charges for trunking and treatment of sewerage but based on the number of gallons discharged for treatment as measured by the flow meter to be installed as part of the County Forcemain Connection.
- 6. The Town agrees to cooperate with the County to secure grant funding that may be available for the County Forcemain Connection.

ARTICLE 4 – COUNTY RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. The SCSD agrees to construct the County Forcemain Connection from Station 70+50 to Station 228+55 as shown on the Plans.
- 2. The SCSD agrees to operate and maintain the County Forcemain Connection as shown on the Plans, including the section constructed by the Town from station 228+55 to station 503+10.
- 3. The SCSD agrees that before any property within the Town of Moreau is permitted to connect to the County Forcemain Connection, the property must be added to a Town sewer district in accordance with all applicable Town of Moreau codes and regulations.
- 4. SCSD agrees to seek NYS Department of Agriculture and Markets approval and, if allowed, adopt a policy restricting the connection of properties within an Agricultural District to the County Connection Forcemain.
- 5. SCSD agrees to take ownership of the Town constructed section of the County Connection Forcemain once all debt and liens are satisfied.
- 6. SCSD agrees to list and maintain a trunking and treatment charge for the Town of Moreau on its official Scale of Charges For SCSD (hereinafter referred to as Scale of Charges), with the unit charge not to exceed the unit charge for any other Town within Saratoga County.
- 7. The SCSD agrees to periodically invoice the Town of Moreau on a Commercial User Equivalent Connection Unit (ECU) basis as defined on the official Scale of Charges.
- 8. The SCSD agrees that the total ECU count for billing will follow the commercial user flow-based method defined on the Scale of Charges which generally consists of five (5) units for the first 412,500 gallons and one (1) additional unit for each additional 75,000 gallons, or part thereof.
- 9. The SCSD agrees to take ownership of the portion of the County Forcemain Connection constructed by the Town after all debt and liens are satisfied.

10. The SCSD agrees to cooperate with the Town to secure grant funding that may be available for the County Forcemain Connection.

ARTICLE 5 – GOVERNING LAW

1. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New York without giving effect to any conflict of law principles.

ARTICLE 6 – GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the Parties with respect to its subject matter. This Agreement may not be amended except by writing, signed by all Parties.
- 2. The parties shall each comply with all applicable rules and regulations, inclusive of State or Federal regulatory agencies.
- 3. No waiver of any breach of any condition of the Agreement shall be binding unless in writing and signed by the Party waiving said breach. No such waiver shall in any way affect any other term or condition of this Agreement or constitute a cause or excuse for a repetition of such or any other breach unless the waiver includes the same.
- 4. This Agreement shall be binding upon the Parties hereto and shall remain in effect in the event of changes to the governing board of either Party.
- 5. This Agreement is not assignable by either Party without that Party's written consent from the other Party.
- 6. The maximum duration of this Agreement is as provided by New York State General Municipal Law.
- 7. The headings of this Agreement are illustrative only and shall not affect the interpretation of this Agreement.
- 8. The invalidity or unenforceability of any provision(s) of this Agreement shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of this Agreement, which shall remain in full force and effect.

SUMMARY

The Board of Supervisors, County IDA, and County Administration negotiated a Host Benefit Agreement with Champlain Hudson Power Express in 2022. The basis of this is to offset impacts within the County for the overland route, primarily along existing railroad tracks. These payouts are expected to start upon completion of the power line, which is projected in 2026 or 2027.

As proposed, the \$126.9 million Host Benefit package from CHPE would be split up over a 30-year period the following way:

- 1/3 (\$42.2 million) would be equally split between all 21 towns/cities.
- 1/3 would be split equally among the 8 towns impacted by the line running through their municipality.
- 1/3 would go to the County and be dedicated to the Capital Facilities Reserve Fund.

Urging the Governor to Veto A.04282B/S.3505B to Move Certain Local Elections to Even-Numbered Years

Whereas, the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors believes that increasing participation in the election process and reducing costs of government operations is good for our republic; and

Whereas, Assembly Member Amy Paulin and State Senator James Skoufis reintroduced legislation that would move local elections to even-number years during the 2023 legislative session; and

Whereas, versions of this legislation were introduced in previous years and failed to reach the floor for a vote due to lack of support; and

Whereas, after the 2022 session concluded, the bill sponsor indicated that hearings would be held on the proposal through the Election Committee process; however, there were no hearings held; and

Whereas, the legislation passed in the middle of the night on the last days of the legislative session which is counter to the idea of an open and transparent government; and

Whereas, the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors has several concerns with this bill; and

Whereas, this legislation usurps the home rule powers reserved by local governments and protected by the Constitution of the State of New York, raising questions of legality and constitutional authority; and

Whereas, local municipalities have had the ability to change their elections to even-number years for decades, and chose not to do so; and

Whereas, we believe that establishing the schedule of local elections is the right of the local government, and has been for more than 100 years; and

Whereas, The Assembly Bill sponsor indicated that she had not received any messages of support for this proposal from any of the 57 Counties and 933 Towns across New York State impacted by this legislation and

Whereas, this legislation excludes more than half of all New Yorkers who vote in cities and villages from the changes to election law, creating an inequity among New York voters; and

Whereas, this legislation unfairly excludes the elections to offices in New York City and all other cities and villages in New York State, as well as certain offices within all counties and towns; and

Whereas, the proposed legislation circumvented the legislative committee process during this session, limiting public input and understanding of the impact; and

Whereas, there has been no financial analysis or operational analysis of the impact on local Boards of Elections; and

Whereas, there are concerns that the election and ballot counting technology would not be able to adequately meet the demands of the significantly increased ballot size; and

Whereas, this will create confusion amongst voters in towns and counties across New York State; and

Whereas, separating the elections affords voters more time to better understand important local issues and provides candidates the appropriate platform to explain their stance on issues; and

Whereas, moving local elections to even-numbered years would increase the cost of campaigns for local office, reducing the number of candidates willing to invest funds into their own campaign, because the cost of media will increase to compete with national and state level campaign advertisements, and

Whereas, there are significant legal and constitutional questions regarding the legality of this measure that have not been adequately addressed; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Board of Supervisors urges the Governor to oppose this legislation and utilize her veto authority to reject this proposal; and

Resolved, that copies of this resolution be distributed by the Clerk of The Board of Supervisors to Governor Kathy Hochul, Senate Majority Leader Andrea Stewart Cousins, Assembly Speaker Carl Heastie, Senate Minority Leader Robert Ortt, Assembly Minority Leader William Barclay, Assembly Bill Sponsor Amy Paulin, Senate Bill Sponsor James Skoufis, Senator James Tedisco, Assemblymember John McDonald, Assemblymember Mary Beth Walsh, Assemblymember Carrie Woerner, and Assemblymember Matthew Simpson
