Graphite Range Community Forest Management Plan

As Saratoga County prepares for a closing on the Graphite Range Community Forest Project, the community forest management plan must be formally adopted by the Board of Supervisors. The document was prepared by the GRCF Advisory Committee. This management plan is a requirement of the USFS grant that will be funding a portion of the acquisition costs. The Plan was reviewed by the Planning and Economic Development Department as well as the County Attorney's Office. Suggested edits have been sent back to the Advisory Committee. The resolution will need to state that the final plan is subject to the approval of the Trails and Open Space Committee Chair, Director of Planning and Economic Development and the County Attorney's Office. The plan will need to be completed with all changes prior to Saratoga County acquiring the property.

The management plan was reviewed at the July Trails and Open Space meeting and additional comments were solicited by the Trails and Open Space Chairman.

2023 County Trails Grants (Board Resolution will be required depending on Committee Recommendation)

The 2023 Municipal Trails Grants have been received and a summary is listed below. In 2023, there were 12 applications received from 12 different municipalities totaling \$120,000.00. The 12 requests have a total project cost of \$356,699.24. The total budgeted amount for 2023 is \$100,000. As the requests exceed the budgeted amount, the final awards will need to be determined at the Trails and Open Space Committee meeting and forwarded on to the Board of Supervisors for vote. Typically, there are three alternatives that are presented for committee approval:

- 1.) Fund all applications at the full request amount and do a budget transfer from fund balance to cover the shortfall. Historically, this is the approach the Committee and Board authorized.
- 2.) Fund all applications at a certain percentage of the total request to keep within budget limits,
- 3.) Critique individual applications and reduce the request to stay within budgeted amount.

Below is a summary of the 2023 Trail grant applications. A spreadsheet with complete project details is attached for committee review.

City of Saratoga Springs

Railroad Run Trail - Lighting

Amount Requested \$10,000

A proposal to install energy-efficient lighting to $\sim 1/2$ mile segment of the trail, between the Saratoga Springs YMCA and NYS Rt 50, that is heavily wooded and dark.

City of Mechanicville

Zim Smith Extension Improvement

Amount Requested \$10,000

To place an asphalt surface on the existing stone dust trail that connects the City of Mechanicville to the Zim Smith Trail off Elizabeth Street Extension and around the City's ball fields.

Town of Ballston

Ballston Creek Preserve Trailhead and Parking Lot

Amount Requested \$10,000

A proposal to provide a trailhead and small parking lot/area for people to access the existing trail on a Saratoga PLAN-owned parcel off of East Line Road. Saratoga PLAN has endorsed the project.

Town of Clifton Park

Town Center Park – Trail Signs

Amount Requested \$10,000

A proposal to provide entrance signage and a kiosk with wayfinding signage at both entrances of the Town Center Park. The informational signage will be placed at 499 Moe Road and at the intersection of Maxwell Drive and Southside Drive that will lead to the existing 0.6 miles of trail in the park.

Town of Edinburg

Fox Hill West Trail Expansion Ph. 2

Amount Requested \$10,000

A continuation of the 2022 trail grant award which will supplement the 2022 work but not duplicate any of the work that includes bridges, clearing and grubbing, grading, and permitting 10 miles of snowmobile path that connects the Saratoga County Snowmobile Trail System with the Great Sacandaga Lake.

Town of Greenfield

Brookhaven Park Trail - Ph. II

Amount Requested \$10,000

A continuation of the 2022 (amended) trail grant award, a proposal to continue placing stone dust on another 0.5-mile segment of the 11-mile trail system at Brookhaven Park.

Town of Halfmoon

Floud Preserve Scenic Outlook

Amount Requested \$10,000

The proposed project will construct a 10'x12' timber platform with interpretive panels along Coons Crossing Rd that overlooks the wetland / shrubland vegetation and wildlife that make up the Floud

Preserve and Anthony Kill. The platform overlook and interpretive panel will connect to the Zim Smith Trail Trailhead on Coons Crossing Rd using a 120' long, 5' wide stone dust trail.

Town of Malta

Malta Nature Preserve Trail Restoration - Year 3

Amount Requested \$10,000

The proposed trail project will be a continuation from a 2020 & a 2021 grant to continue restoring the trails by laying down more engineered wood fiber in the needed areas to keep the trail dry and walkable. Some of the trail has broken down quicker due to its wet nature.

Town of Milton

Woods Hollow Nature Preserve Trailhead Improvements

Amount Requested \$10,000

Proposed improvements are enhancing signage and resurface visitor parking areas, where applicable, at each of the five trail heads to Woods Hollow Nature Preserve. Signage at each trailhead will provide visitors updated mapping of the trail network that includes distance, topography, and natural features.

Town of Moreau

Scenic Hudson River/Big Bend Trail - Ph. I Amenities

Amount Requested \$10,000

A proposal to place trail amenities to Phase I of the trail such as: bicycle rack, bench seating and a vehicular access gate.

Town of Northumberland

Hudson Crossing Park

Amount Requested \$10,000

A proposal to rehab the park's existing trail network with stone dust by prioritizing the highly traveled trail segment from the parking lot leading to the Riverwalk Sensory trail.

Town of Stillwater

Bemis Heights Historic Trail -Ph. II

Amount Requested \$10,000

The Town's Phase I study produced further need for additional studies due to additional wetlands and difficult topography encountered in the northern third of the trail. Phase II funding will specifically assist in wetlands survey, trail route and mapping adjustments and schematic trail design with the preparation of a cost estimate for construction.

NYS Snowmobile Grant Application

On behalf of the Saratoga County Association of Snowmobile Clubs, the Planning and Economic Development Department is requesting acceptance by the Trails and Open Space Committee – and to be forwarded to the Board of Supervisors – an application for a NYS Snowmobile Trails Grant-in-Aid Program estimated not to exceed \$80,000. These are pass through funds that go directly to the clubs of the Saratoga County Association of Snowmobile Clubs, so there is no budget impact.

According to the latest NYS OPRHP report, in the 2021-22 season (2022-23 report not issued yet), \$5,783,195 was collected from the 114,479 registrations and \$4,246,752 was budgeted to provide financial support for the maintenance and development of the statewide trail system, which is comprised of 10,552 miles in 45 counties. This revenue is returned to the over 200 local Snowmobile Clubs as

reimbursement for grants-in-aid for snowmobile trail development and maintenance thru 52 municipal Sponsors.

Since 1994 Saratoga County has served as the Local Municipal Sponsor for the NYS Snowmobile Trails Grant-in-Aid Program administered by NYS OPRHP. The Saratoga County Association of Snowmobile Clubs, comprised of the Charlton, Country Trailblazers, Galway, Lincoln Mountain, and the Saratoga Snowmobile Association; develop, maintain, and operate 181 miles of state grant-funded trails through 19 municipalities within Saratoga County. The trail mileage proposed for the 2023-2024 season is the same as what was finalized for the 2022-2023 season.

The source of grant funds originates with the registration of snowmobiles, last year Saratoga County had the 5th most snowmobile registrations in NYS.

In the 2022-2023 season the Saratoga County Association of Snowmobile Clubs spent \$121,947.95 for equipment, signs and materials, groomer usage, and miscellaneous expenses. The Saratoga County Association of Snowmobile Clubs received \$69,504 through the grant program and distributed the funds to each club based on mileage.

Permission is received from landowners for the clubs to operate the trail system on their respective properties. Municipal and county approval is necessary where those trails cross or occupy the local or county right of way. A map and mileage chart is attached to the memo illustrating the 2023-2024 proposed trail segments. There is no cost to the individual landowners to operate the trail system. Additionally, the grant program creates no budget impact to Saratoga County as snowmobile registrations fund 100% of the grant awards. These funds are received from NYS and passed on to the snowmobile clubs in Saratoga County.

County Forestland / Zim Smith Trail Updates / County Grant Updates

- As per a July 14, 2023 email, the Executive Director of Saratoga PLAN has requested the 2022 Town of Milton/Bombard Farm with an award of \$124,762.00 be relinquished as the project is no longer considered viable.
- There are currently 5 pending Open Space/Farmland Protection Projects being administered by the Planning Department. Of the 7 projects, 2 are 2022 (last year) awards and 3 are prior awards.
 The Town of Greenfield's 2022 Open Space grant project is closed.
- Currently, there are 14 pending Trail Projects being administered by the Planning Department.
 Of the 14 projects, 11 are 2022 (last year) awards and three are prior awards with the 2022 Town of Moreau award closing in July.
- The 2023 Saratoga County Farm Protection and Open Space grant applications are due July 28, 2023.
- County Timber Bids are due August 10th for the Edie Road South Project.

AUTHORIZING THE ADOPTION OF A COMMUNITY FOREST MANAGEMENT PLAN IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE UNITED STATES FORESTRY SERVICE COMMUNITY FOREST GRANT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 333-2021, this Board authorized the County to enter into a memorandum of agreement with Saratoga P.L.A.N., Inc. to establish the Saratoga County Community Forest project ("Community Forest") located on approximately 202 acres in the Town of Greenfield and the Town of Wilton, which is commonly referred to as the Graphite Range Community Forest; and

WHEREAS, the County anticipates acquiring the Community Forest property in 2023 with funds provided by the U.S. Forest Service and its Community Forest Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, as a condition of being eligible to receive funds from the Community Forest Grant Program, a Community Forest Management Plan ("Management Plan") must be adopted by the County within 120 days from the date of acquisition; and

WHEREAS, the Community Forest Grant Program mandates that the Community Forest Management Plan set forth the approved management actions to be undertaken by the County to guide the management and use of the Community Forest; and

WHEREAS, our Trails and Open Space Committee and the Director of Planning and Economic Development have recommended that the County adopt the Community Forest Management Plan for the Graphite Range Community Forest; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, the Chair is authorized to execute any and all agreements and other documents necessary to ensure the fulfillment of said conditions and the transfer of said funds; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the form and content of such agreements, other documents, and the Community Forest Management Plan shall be subject to the approval of the County Attorney; and it is further

RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

AWARDING 2023 TRAILS GRANTS, AND AMENDING THE 2023 COUNTY BUDGET IN RELATION THERETO

WHEREAS, the 2023 Saratoga County Budget included a Trails Grant Program to give matching grants to local municipalities to fund trail development and construction projects; and

WHEREAS, the 2023 Trails Grant Program provides a pool of up to \$100,000 to fund trail feasibility studies, engineering work, and construction in local municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the Trails and Open Space Committee received twelve applications for funding \$120,000, which the Committee recommended to be fully funded; and

WHEREAS, our Trails and Open Space Committee and Law and Finance Committee approved fully funding all twelve applications submitted, at a cost of \$120,000 through the transfer and utilization of \$20,000 from fund balance; and

WHEREAS, the funding in full of all 2023 Trails Grant Program applications received requires an amendment to the 2023 Saratoga County Budget; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors authorizes the payment under the 2023 Trails Grant Program of the sum of \$100,000 plus the transfer and payment of \$20,000 from fund balance to the following municipalities for the purposes stated, upon condition that each municipality provide matching funds or services in-kind:

- 1. <u>City of Saratoga Springs</u>: The amount of \$10,000 to be applied towards the Saratoga Springs Railroad Run Trail Improvements to include the installation of energy-efficient lighting to ~1/2-mile segment of the trail, between the Saratoga Springs YMCA and NYS Rt 50 that is heavily wooded and dark.
- 2. <u>City of Mechanicville</u>: The amount of \$10,000 to be applied towards the Zim Smith Trail Extension Improvement to include the placement of an asphalt surface on the existing stone dust trail that connects the City of Mechanicville to the Zim Smith Trail off Elizabeth Street Extension and around the City's ball fields.

- 3. <u>Town of Ballston</u>: The amount of \$10,000 to be applied towards the Ballston Creek Preserve to include a trailhead and small parking lot/area for people to access the existing trail on a Saratoga PLAN-owned parcel off of East Line Road.
- 4. <u>Town of Clifton Park</u>: The amount of \$10,000 towards the Town Center Park to include entrance signage and a kiosk with wayfinding signage at both entrances of the Town Center Park. The informational signage will be placed at 499 Moe Road and at the intersection of Maxwell Drive and Southside Drive that will lead to the existing 0.6 miles of trail in the park.
- 5. Town of Edinburg: The amount of \$10,000 towards the Fox Hill West Trail Expansion Ph. 2 to include a continuation of the 2022 trail grant award which will supplement the 2022 work but not duplicate any of the work that includes bridges, clearing and grubbing, grading, and permitting of the 10 miles of snowmobile path that connects the Saratoga County Snowmobile Trail System with the Great Sacandaga Lake.
- 6. <u>Town of Greenfield</u>: The amount of \$10,000 towards the Brookhaven Park Trail. Improvement to include a continuation of the 2022 (amended 2023) trail grant award, a proposal to continue placing stone dust on another 0.5-mile segment of the 11-mile trail system at Brookhaven Park.
- 7. Town of Halfmoon: The amount of \$10,000 towards the Floud Preserve Scenic Outlook to include the construction a 10' x 12' timber platform with interpretive panels along Coons Crossing Rd that overlooks the wetland / shrubland vegetation and wildlife that make up the Floud Preserve and Anthony Kill. The platform overlook and interpretive panel will connect to the Zim Smith Trail Trailhead on Coons Crossing Rd using a 120' long, 5' wide stone dust trail.
- 8. <u>Town of Malta</u>: The amount of \$10,000 towards the Malta Nature Preserve Trail Restoration Year 3 to include a continuation from a 2020 & a 2021 grant to continue restoring the trails by laying down more engineered wood fiber in the needed areas to keep the trail dry and walkable.

- 12. <u>Town of Stillwater</u>: The amount of \$10,000 towards the Bemis Heights Historic Trail -Ph. II to include the further need for studies due to additional wetlands and difficult topography encountered in the northern third of the trail. Phase II funding will specifically assist in wetlands survey, trail route and mapping adjustments and schematic trail design with the preparation of a cost estimate for construction.


