AUTHORIZING THE CONVEYANCE OF TAX-ACQUIRED LANDS IN THE TOWN OF HALFMOON TO THE SARATOGA COUNTY SEWER DISTRICT NO. 1

WHEREAS, Tax Parcel 267.-2-13 is a vacant parcel of land located on Route 146 in the Town of Halfmoon, New York ("Property"); and

WHEREAS, the real property taxes on the Property remained unpaid since tax year 2018, resulting in the Property being included in the County's in rem tax foreclosure proceeding for Tax Year 2018; and

WHEREAS, the redemption period has expired and no Answer to the County's tax foreclosure Petition was received from the former owner or any interested party; and

WHEREAS, upon motion by the County, the Saratoga County Court granted fee title ownership of the Property to the County by Order and Judgment dated February 10, 2023; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Order and Judgment, the County's Tax Enforcing Officer conveyed the Property to the County of Saratoga by deed dated February 10, 2023; and

WHEREAS, due to the Property's proximity to the County's wastewater treatment plant, the Executive Director of the Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1 ("Sewer District") has requested that the Property be conveyed to the Sewer District for administrative use; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the County to cancel delinquent and current taxes on the Property to allow the Sewer District to operate its facilities free from any outstanding debt; and

WHEREAS, the property has delinquent taxes for the years 2018 to 2023 inclusive totaling \$ 13,820.03; and

WHEREAS, this Board's Real Property Tax Committee, Saratoga County's Tax Enforcing Officer, Executive Director of the Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1, and the Director of the Real Property Tax Service Office recommend that the County convey the Property to the Sewer District for the amount of all delinquent tax, penalties & interest now, therefore, be it **RESOLVED**, that the Chair of the Board is hereby authorized to execute a deed and any other documents necessary to effect the conveyance to Saratoga County Sewer District No. 1 of Tax Parcel 267.-2-13 with the form and content of such deed and documents being subject to the approval of the County Attorney; and it is further.

AMENDING RESOLUTION 296-2021, AUTHORIZING AMENDMENTS TO MENTAL HEALTH CONTRACTS TO INCLUDE STATE-FUNDED COST OF LIVING INCREASES, AND AMENDING THE 2023 COUNTY BUDGET IN RELATION THERETO

WHEREAS, Resolution 296-2021, which authorized ongoing contracts for mental health services, subject to State appropriations, and thereafter amended by Resolutions: 74-2022; 75-2022; 200-2022; 202-2022; 326-2022; 344-2022; 76-2023; 95-2023; 179-2023 and 201-2023; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 296-2021 further authorized the Health and Human Services Committee to accept additional grant funds from the State of New York in support of the Services to be rendered by the contracting agencies listed in Resolution 296-2021, provided the additional grant funds did not exceed 10% of the contract amounts set forth in Resolution 296-2021; and

WHEREAS, additional funds have become available from New York State Office of Mental Health ("OMH") in the amount of \$2,511, for cost of living adjustments ("COLA"), effective April 1, 2023, allocated to the following mental health service providers contractually retained pursuant to Resolution 296-2021:

AUTHORIZING AN AMENDED AGREEMENT WITH NORTHEAST PARENT AND CHILD SOCIETY, INC. FOR THE PROVISION OF RESPITE SERVICES

WHEREAS, the Community Services Board assists our Commissioner of Mental Health and Addiction Services in administrating the County's many varied mental health programs; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 296-2021 authorized contracts with certain mental health service providers for a term of three years commencing January 1, 2022 and terminating December 31, 2024, including Captain Community Human Services Corp. (CCHS) and Northeast Parent and Child Society, Inc. (NPCS); and

WHEREAS, the contract with CCHS included the provision of respite services utilized by Clinic Youth Services, and CCHS has discontinued the provision of respite services, requiring the transfer of funding in the amount of \$14,071; and

WHEREAS, NPCS will now provide respite services utilized by Clinic Youth Services for an additional amount of \$14,071, for a total contract in an amount not to exceed \$28,142; and

WHEREAS, our Health and Human Services Committee and the Commissioner of Mental Health and Addiction Services have recommended the transfer of funding from CCHS to NPCS in the amount of \$14,071 for the provision of respite services, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$28,142; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board is authorized to execute an amended agreement with Northeast Parent and Child Society, Inc. of Albany, New York, to include the transfer amount of \$14,071 for the provision of respite services, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$28,142; and it is further

AUTHORIZING A PURCHASE AGREEMENT FOR THE ACQUISITION OF FEE PARCEL AND A PERMANENT CONSTRUCTION EASEMENT ASSOCIATED WITH THE REPLACEMENT OF THE LASHER ROAD BRIDGE OVER THE MOURNING KILL IN THE TOWN OF BALLSTON

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 314-2021, this Board adopted the 2022-2026 Saratoga County Capital Plan which included among its capital projects the replacement of the Lasher Road Bridge over the Mourning Kill, BIN 3304700, PIN 1761.79 in the Town of Ballston; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 338-2021, the County retained the services of Greenman-Pedersen, Inc. to provide design and construction administration services related to the replacement of the Lasher Road Bridge over the Mourning Kill, BIN 3304700, PIN 1761.79; and

WHEREAS, Greenman-Pedersen, Inc. has identified one (1) fee parcel and one (1) permanent easement that the County needs to acquire from an adjoining landowner for the project; and

WHEREAS, the fee parcel needed is a $1,100 \pm \text{sq.}$ ft. parcel and the permanent easement needed is a $4,510 \pm \text{sq.}$ ft. easement both from Ronald Malloch, the owner of Tax Parcel #226.-1-43.1, on Randall Road, Town of Ballston, the total cost of which fee parcel and permanent easement has been established at \$600 per an agreement between the County and said owner; and

WHEREAS, our Public Works Committee and the Commissioner of Public Works have recommended that the County enter into a purchase agreement with Ronald Malloch for the acquisition of a $1,100 \pm$ sq. ft. fee parcel and a $4,510 \pm$ sq. ft. permanent easement across a portion of Tax Parcel #226.-1-43.1, at a cost of \$600; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board is hereby authorized to execute a purchase agreement with Ronald Malloch for the acquisition of a $1,100 \pm$ sq. ft. fee parcel and a $4,510 \pm$ sq. ft. permanent easement across a portion of Tax Parcel #226.-1-43.1, at a cost of \$600; and it is further

WHEREAS, the New York State Clean Water Infrastructure Act of 2017 established the Septic System Replacement Fund ("the Fund") to provide property owners a source of funding for the replacement of failing cesspools and septic systems servicing residences and small businesses in New York State; and
