WHEREAS, these Child Care Block Grant allocations are completely federally reimbursed; and

WHEREAS, the Health and Human Services Committee and the Commissioner of Social Services recommend the acceptance of these additional funds; and

WHEREAS, the acceptance of these additional Child Care Block Grant allocations requires this Board's approval; and

WHEREAS, if the allocations are accepted by the Board then the \$1,268,058 needs to be added to the DSS budget for expenditure of these funds and receipt of associated reimbursements; now, therefore, be it

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 45 – 2023, this Board authorized the County to participate in the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (hereinafter “EFC”) Septic System Replacement Program for the term commencing January 1, 2023 and expiring December 31, 2026, and authorized the execution of a County Participation Agreement with the EFC; and

WHEREAS, the Program is being administered for the County by the Saratoga County Soil and Water Conservation District; and

WHEREAS, two (2) property owners in the Town of Clifton Park submitted grant applications to the County’s Soil and Water Conservation District requesting an award of Program funds for the replacement of the aging septic system on their properties; and

WHEREAS, the County’s Soil and Water Conservation District determined that said proposed septic system projects would significantly and quantifiably reduce potential environmental and/or public health impacts that could result from the aging septic systems, and issued an award letter to the applications notifying them of the award of Program funds for the reimbursement of their eligible project costs; and

WHEREAS, the property owners have completed their septic system replacement projects, and have applied to the County’s Soil and Water Conservation District for the disbursement of their grant award of Program funds; and

WHEREAS, the County’s Soil and Water Conservation District made an application for the EFC for disbursement of Program funds awarded for these septic system projects, and the EFC has distributed total funds in the amount of \$14,433.75 to the County in reimbursement of the eligible costs of said projects; and

BE IT ENACTED by the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors as follows:

SECTION 1. Title. This Local Law shall be known as “A LOCAL LAW AMENDING LOCAL LAW NO. 3 OF 2006 AS AMENDED BY LOCAL LAW NO. 1 OF 2023 TO PROVIDE AN EXTENSION OF THE TAX EXEMPTION FOR VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS, VOLUNTEER AMBULANCE WORKERS, AND UN-REMARRIED SPOUSES OF VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS AND VOLUNTEER AMBULANCE WORKERS KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY”

WHEREAS, the Law and Finance Committee, the Clerk of the Board, and the County Attorney have recommended that the County enter into an amended agreement with Coughlin & Gerhart, L.L.P., to provide professional legal services pertaining to FOIL requests and other matters as authorized by the County, at an hourly rate of \$295 for partners, an hourly rate of \$250 for special counsel and of counsel, an hourly rate of \$225 for associates, and an hourly rate of \$165 for paralegals, increasing the contract’s limit to a not to exceed amount of \$30,000; now, therefore, be it

WHEREAS, the total of “Implementation Services One-Time Costs” plus the two (2) months of ASP Hosting Fees and the 10% contingency equal \$101,600; now, therefore, be it,

RESOLVED, that the total cost of services for 2024 shall not exceed \$101,600; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized to execute all documents and agreements with Hamer Enterprises necessary for the implementation of a Property Tax Collection System; and be it further
